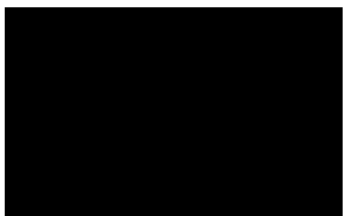

Dear Director-General Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus,

I’ ve become aware of some concerns about your new pandemic treaty proposal expressed by Dr. Mercola in the attached article ( “The Pandemic Treaty Is a Spreading Plague” ). Much of the information stirred a familiar fear in me. Do I want to have medical procedures forced upon me in which I have little confidence and considerable concerns? I ran into this dilemma very strongly

after reading an article a year ago about the way the FDA cut short studies on the newly developed mRNA vaccines for COVID19 for financial reasons (see: <https://washingtonmonthly.com/2021/03/26/the-fda-cut-off-covid-vaccine-testing-that-was-a-really-bad-idea/>). When I looked at their funders and saw the Bill and Melinda Gates foundation (<https://washingtonmonthly.com/about/>), I became convinced that this wasn't simply an effort to stir up controversy without reason. I've also experienced the limitations of the established medical model while attempting to [REDACTED]

I know that alternative methods have their limitations too, so I've dug deeper on my path to health. One thing that I've experienced to be a very powerful driver to health or illness is social relationships. He has a new book on the role of culture that I have yet to read that is bound to be interesting (<https://drgabormate.com/book/the-myth-of-normal/>).

I would like you to find a way to include the needs and perspectives of Dr Mercola and the Maori people as you work on your pandemic treaty. We all fear illness and death. This fear is what drives divisive high stress human relationships. Yet a great scientist like Einstein says it is an illusion (see quote below). Division nurtures his "illusion". Cooperation and mutual support force us to overcome it. If there is something I can do to help you with this process of social and spiritual healing, please let me know. I'd be happy to do what I can for you.

Most Honourable Prime Minister & Honourable Members,

I am writing to insist that you stand against the proposed WHO (World Health Organization) agreement, which is unnecessary, and is a threat to sovereignty and inalienable rights. The proposed Agreement increases the WHO's power to declare possibly unjustified pandemics, impose what might be seen as dehumanising lockdowns, and enforce potentially expensive, unsafe and ineffective treatments against the will of the people.

I believe that the people have a right to participate in any agreement that affects their lives, livelihoods and well-being. I believe that Human Rights, Civil Rights, The Nuremberg Codes, and Canadian Constitution and Charter Rights all preclude authoritarian over-riding of peoples' rights to bodily autonomy, and other personal and collective freedoms.

The WHO has not engaged in a process of public participation, which is evidence that its priority is capturing more power for itself and its corporate accomplices, rather than serving the interests of the people. Without an unbiased democratic process, any agreement by the WHO, acting via the United Nations, will be unlawful, illegitimate and invalid.

Historically, the WHO leadership has failed the people. Among many examples, it approved the injurious H1N1 (swine flu) vaccine for a controversially declared pandemic. Equally, the WHO failed during the Covid-19 chapter as it encouraged lockdowns, suppressed early preventive treatments and recommended product interventions that have proven to be neither safe nor effective.

On May 25, Canada cast a "No" vote against a resolution to improve the health conditions in the occupied Palestinian territory (OPT), including East Jerusalem, and in the occupied Syrian Golan. The next day, Canada co-sponsored a similar motion regarding Russian attacks on the health sector in Ukraine. This discrepancy in Canada's approach demands an explanation.

The resolution on health care in the OPT, which Canada opposed, requested the World Health Organization (WHO) General-Director to support the Palestinian health sector, ensure non-discriminatory access to medical care, and ensure the protection of health workers. The resolution noted a report by the Director-General which had highlighted the severe cost to Palestinian health caused by Israeli hostilities, and Israel's punitive and discriminatory permit regime which restricts access to care. The report recorded 235 attacks against health care in the OPT in 2021, causing the injury of 106 health workers and damage to 57 ambulances and 124 health facilities. Similarly, the WHO has verified 58 attacks on healthcare in the OPT since the beginning of 2022, causing one death and 47 injuries. Canada should support every initiative to end this intolerable situation; as such, its vote against the resolution is inexplicable.

What made Canada's vote on May 25 particularly insulting was that it came one day after your address to the WHA plenary, in which you stated that "there can be no health without peace." As you rightfully said in your remarks:

"[We] need to be united in our unequivocal condemnation of all wars, including Putin's unjustifiable invasion of Ukraine, **and we need to be firm in our condemnation of any and all attacks targeting health workers**, health care supplies, and health facilities."

Two days later, on May 26, Canada co-sponsored a resolution titled "Health emergency in Ukraine ... stemming from the Russian Federation's aggression." The resolution "condemn[ed] in the strongest terms" Russia's attacks on health care facilities in Ukraine, making its language far more pointed than the milder resolution on health care in the OPT.

We agree that any and all attacks on health workers must be condemned, and it is right for the international community to condemn the perpetrators of such attacks in the strongest terms. Unfortunately, in its "No" vote on May 25, Canada made a deliberate decision not to apply this principle to the situation facing Palestinians,

who suffer from similar attacks by Israeli occupation forces. This demonstrates a clear double standard, sending the message that international law does not apply to all states, and that some lives are worth more than others.

Canada should condemn Israeli attacks on health care, just as it would condemn the same behaviour by any other state. Canadians deserve a full explanation for the discrepancy in these votes. I look forward to hearing from you regarding this matter.



Dear Minister Duclos,

As the Head of Canada's delegation to the 75th World Health Assembly meeting in Geneva this week, you are entrusted with a tremendous responsibility, especially as it relates to the amendments to the International Health Regulations.

Canadians are concerned about the vote this week and are counting on you as their representative to defend our healthcare sovereignty and take steps to ensure that the declaration of pandemics and management thereof, are not ceded to the unelected, unaccountable World Health Organization.

Less than a week ago [REDACTED]  
With a very brief window for public consultations being discussed for this summer, I wanted to make sure Canadians could speak up on this important topic now. So far more than [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] the immediate concern is the International Health Regulation amendments. - Vote against all 13 amendments to the IHR proposed by the Working group
- Launch public consultations with Canadians to receive their views on whether you should engage in the broader Pandemic Treaty process
- Call the long-awaited public inquiry into your government's handling of COVID-19, so we can all learn from mistakes that were made in the management of the COVID-19 and create our own pandemic response policy

Canadians feel very passionately about our healthcare system, and want to know that their federal government and elected officials at all levels are entrusted to act in their best interest, and are accountable to them. There is growing concern about unelected officials within international organizations making healthcare decisions on their behalf during a pandemic.

I pray you make the wise decision, and protect Canada's healthcare sovereignty.

Minister Jean-Yves Duclos;

I sent an email to you before you left for Europe to discuss the WHO International Health Regulations.

I received no acknowledgement from your side and now you are back on Canadian soil.

It has been difficult to decode all the announcements emanating from many sides after the May 22-28 meeting.

My takeaway is that there is still no agreement on a go forward but my sense is that the plan remains to grant unbelievable powers to the WHO to recognize, coordinate and execute strategies to address future health issues without essential consultation and agreement with national governments.

Sounds like ceding national sovereignty to me. Limited initially to health but it is a slippery slope that would lead to ceding national sovereignty in other areas of strictly Canadian oversight.

My position is that you and your government do not have the authority to give away Canadian health sovereignty to a foreign entity. With only 30% of the popular vote in the last election certainly does not qualify your party to take unilateral action on this critical issue.

Very little coverage in mainstream media. If there was, I am confident that literally tens of millions of Canadians would be fiercely objecting to such treason.

And this is why it is essential that any giveaway of our sovereignty be voted on by Canadians in a national referendum. Similar proposal has been put forward in Australia.

Almost 50 countries in Africa have voiced their disapproval in addition to others in Asia. Brazil would leave the WHO if this theft of sovereignty moves forward.

It is quite incredible that so many Western nations (US, Canada, EU) continue to consider the WHO the prime world leader for overall international health issues.

The WHO is a shadow of its former self. In my opinion, the WHO deserves a failing grade for its action on covid-19.

Why do I say this?

The WHO is no longer 100% funded by governments. For years, the WHO has increasingly depended upon privately funded NGO's – the largest being the Bill and Belinda Gates Foundation - getting to 1 USD billion over the past 2 years.

However, Gates has deep conflict of interest connections to several pharmaceutical companies. He has even boasted that his initial \$10 billion investment in international health will return him \$200 billion.

So let's not be naïve. Gates and his pharma 'buddies' are not our friends. First and foremost, they are out to make profits for themselves and their shareholders and in so doing gain complete control over global health delivery.

The following summarizes events that point to WHO failures with respect to covid-19.

1. The PCR test used (and still being used) was never designed to test for pathogens – this according to Kary Mullis, inventor of the PCR test. Far too many false/positives. But effective for generating FEAR.
2. Masks, distancing, lockdowns now in hindsight did not appreciably eliminate mortality. More FEAR. Significant drops in social development and IQ among children.
3. Mental tragedies (suicides, drug overdoses), family violence, etc. along with economic damage to businesses has been catastrophic.
4. Gene therapy products injected in far too many people were never properly clinically tested and peer reviewed for safety and effectiveness. Check out US VAERS for deaths in excess of 30,000 and over 1 million vaccine injuries. Causation has been shown conclusively that the vaccine is guilty of killing.

5. The gene therapy products were never designed to kill the virus. The Emergency Use Authorization only addressed symptoms of the virus. Now shown to have no effectiveness against stopping viral transmission.
6. There never has been any attempt to determine deaths in Canada of those “with’ covid or ‘from’ covid. Big difference. Deaths due strictly to ‘from’ covid are significantly lower in US & Europe.
7. Survival rates – those under 50 well up and over 99%. Even those over 50, 95% +.
8. WHO and pharma were aware that the vaccine travelled throughout the body penetrating soft organs with severe consequences.
9. It was strongly recommended (Barrington Declaration) that those over 65 should be the focus of early treatment. This was ignored in favor of a blitzkrieg approach on the entire population. Still 80% of deaths were in seniors over 65 – many with comorbidities.
10. Approval of injections of under 30 were known not to be necessary. Young people are amazingly resilient. However, after jabs, teenage males were highly susceptible to heart issues and unnecessary deaths.
11. Deaths among healthy people 25-64 have exploded well beyond normal death levels vs comparable year ago levels – the vaccine has been the only possible explanation.

Canada has been party to the IHR, a legally binding international agreement, since 2005 and fulfilling our responsibilities and obligations under it has not impinged Canadian sovereignty. Amendments to the IHR (2005) is a separate but complementary process. At the 75th WHA, no vote took place on proposed amendments. Member States, including Canada, agreed by consensus on a forward process to consider possible amendments to the IHR (2005). As with the existing IHR, any amendments would continue to respect the sovereignty of all the signing parties, including Canada. 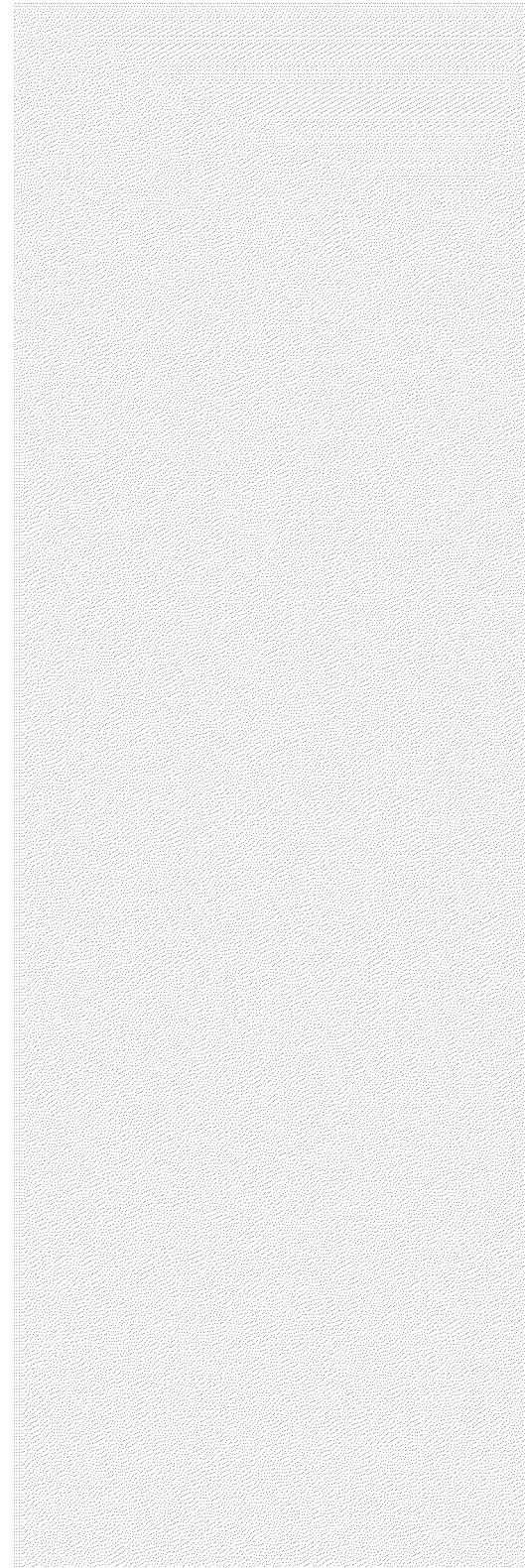

COVID-19 has demonstrated the need to take bold action to ensure we are better prepared for the next pandemic, which is why Canada is working closely with international partners, including the World Health Organization (WHO) to strengthen global pandemic prevention, preparedness and response.

In December 2021, Canada supported the decision to develop a new instrument on pandemic prevention, preparedness and response at the Special Session of the WHO's World Health Assembly (WHA). Member States are leading the development process through an Intergovernmental Negotiating Body (INB), with input from a broad range of stakeholders. In preparation for the beginning of formal negotiations in early 2023, the conceptual zero draft, as well as the negotiation process will be discussed at the third INB meeting on December 5-7, 2022. The INB is aiming to present a final product to the 77th WHA in May 2024 for consideration and potential adoption. More information on the pandemic instrument can be found here: <https://inb.who.int/>.

In addition to developing a new instrument, we are also working on improving the tools and mechanisms we already have based on lessons learned not only from COVID-19 but also from previous emergencies. For examples, at the 75th WHA in May 2022, Member States, including Canada, agreed on a forward process to consider possible amendments to the International Health Regulations (IHR) (2005), a WHO instrument aimed at keeping Canadians healthy and safe through commitments and obligations that require countries to work together in a global health emergency, like COVID-19. This amendment process is expected to take two years.

Canada supports these efforts under the WHO to improve multilateral cooperation, enhance collective action and accountability and address gaps in pandemic prevention, preparedness and response, and will be actively engaged in both processes to ensure Canada's interests and values are protected in negotiations.

Dear Honorable Jean-Yves Duclos,

We respectfully raise the critical issue of the proposed International Treaty on Pandemic Prevention and Preparedness and the proposed amendments to the International Health Regulations (IHR) <sup>[1]</sup> currently under negotiation by the Government and other member States of the World Health Organization (WHO). We call on you to oppose these proposed agreements by raising this issue *in Parliament*, demanding debate and open review, in the interests of preserving national sovereignty and individual rights.

These agreements seek to impose WHO dictates in place of national sovereignty and the rights of an individual to make choices regarding their own body and health, and is demonstrably inappropriate and disproportionate from a public health viewpoint.

### Basic principles governing public health

The breadth of factors impacting an individual's health, and the importance of personal, community and national control over health, are reflected in principles previously accepted by the World Health Organization:

*Definition of health: Health is a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity. (Constitution of the WHO, 1946) <sup>[2]</sup>*

*Informed opinion and active co-operation on the part of the public are of the utmost importance in the improvement of the health of the people. (Constitution of the WHO, 1946) <sup>[2]</sup>*

*The people have the right and duty to participate individually and collectively in the planning and implementation of their health care. (Article IV, Declaration of Alma Ata, 1978) <sup>[3]</sup>*

The UN Declaration of Human Rights <sup>[4]</sup>, 1948, also supports the fundamental rights of the individual: *All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights.*

### Public health priority of pandemics

Pandemics severely affecting a high proportion of younger and middle-aged people have not occurred since the pre-antibiotic era (1918-20), when a majority of deaths were considered to be due to secondary bacterial <sup>[5]</sup> infections. The WHO lists only four pandemics <sup>[6]</sup> in the 120 years prior to Covid-19; 1918-19, 1957-58, 1968-69, and 2009-10, with only 1918-19 causing more than 1.1 million deaths. Severe pandemics are rare events. The Covid-19 pandemic, whilst resulting in considerable disruption and collateral harm, resulted in mortality at an average age <sup>[7]</sup> similar to that of all-cause mortality, with severity concentrated within clearly identifiable population groups <sup>[8]</sup>.

The diversion of resources and various mitigation measures used mostly unsuccessfully during the Covid-19 public health response are demonstrated to have had a considerable negative impact on the economy and healthcare access. In doing so, they divert resources to private and corporate entities that are closely allied with WHO in

promoting the proposed health emergency program. This underlines the importance of national and local control in time of disease outbreaks to ensure long-term harms do not outweigh intended short-term benefit, responses are in line with population priorities, and free of conflict of interest.

### **Dangers of the proposed agreements**

*This proposed treaty and IHR amendments raise a number of fundamental concerns that we believe should lead to their immediate abandonment:*

- 1. People in countries complying with these instruments will lose sovereignty over major aspects of daily life to unelected international bureaucrats, who are subject to significant conflicts of interest from private individuals and industry.*
- 2. These WHO bureaucrats will decide on the criteria for and timing of such take-overs.*
- 3. The track record of the WHO in managing international outbreaks is poor. It is inherently dangerous to delegate control over complex issues that heavily impact the economy, society and public health to individuals in a distant location with no community or relevant national affiliations, and no direct stake in the outcomes.*
- 4. Such centralization is contrary to the fundamental pillars of community-based, locally organised healthcare, and antithetical to the principles of individual rights and autonomy upon which the WHO's constitution is based.*
- 5. The increasing emphasis on pandemics instead of on the actual major causes of human illness and mortality is inappropriate, and the diversion of funds and activity will have hugely negative impacts on overall population and individual health.*

*The world needs international forums for sharing data, for concentrating technical expertise to support countries lacking these and to facilitate discussions between countries concerning health issues, including emergencies. Such organisations must be in service of member countries and their people, not act as unelected authorities, funded and influenced by conflicted, non-national interests that attempt to direct and control the lives of free citizens.*

The definition of pandemic and health emergency used by the WHO are arbitrary<sup>[10]</sup>, leaving the decision to subvert national sovereignty in health matters at the whim of individual interpretation.

The WHO was set up after World War II as a body to serve countries, governed by them, and not as a body that would govern the actions of member states. Our laws and process of governance have developed over centuries to protect the rights of individuals and to preserve national sovereignty at the will of the people. It is imperative that those setting policy and rules on complex issues have a direct stake in the outcomes.

**We therefore request that steps be taken urgently to review the sovereignty and health issues that are at risk through the process currently under way, and to ensure that the role of the WHO, and other international organisations, remains strictly advisory and technical, whilst all decisions affecting citizens remain within the ambit of local and national government as well as the individuals themselves.**

Canada's sovereignty is currently being negotiated away in secret via pending amendments to the International Health Regulations (IHR) and via the proposed WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION (W.H.O.) 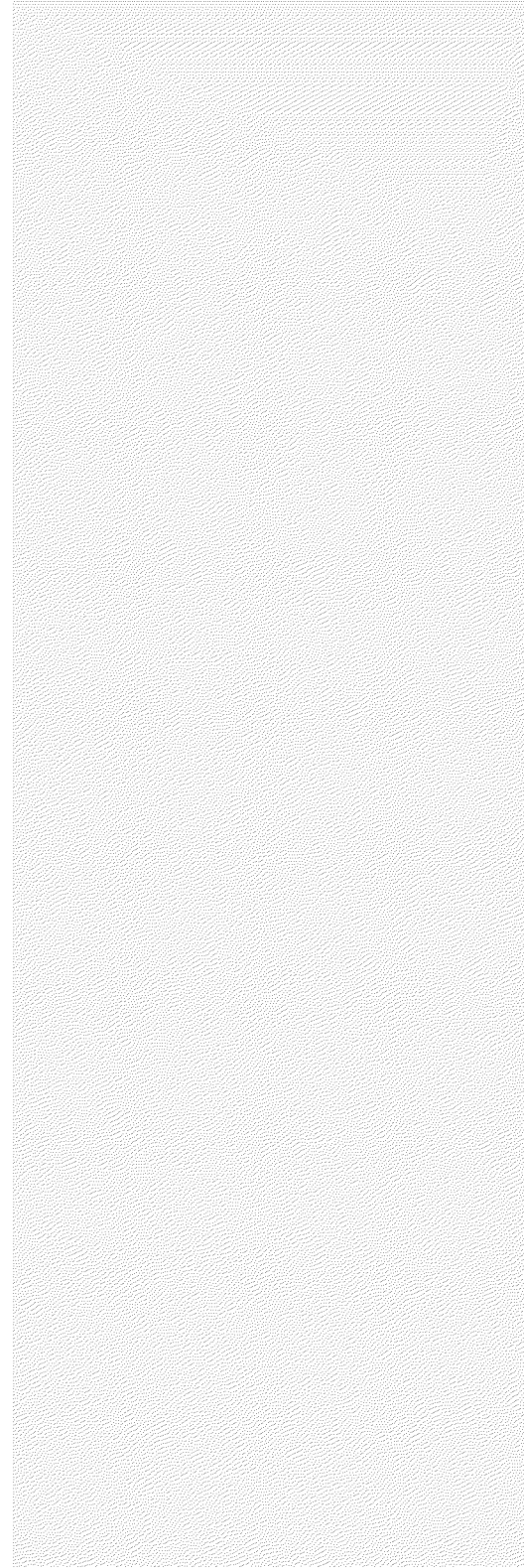

This includes actively participating in the development of a pandemic instrument. The Government of Canada will work to ensure that Canadian priorities and values are reflected as we continue to engage in this process. Member States will continue to lead the process to develop the instrument, which is expected to be presented at the 77th World Health Assembly in May 2024 for consideration and potential adoption.

Canada is also a signatory to the IHR (2005), which is an important tool to keep Canadians healthy and safe through commitments and obligations that require countries to work together in a global health emergency. At the 75<sup>th</sup> World Health Assembly in May 2022, Member States, including Canada, agreed by consensus on a forward process to consider possible amendments to the IHR (2005). Member States themselves are leading the process and deciding on the content. As the starting point for this process, Member States were invited to submit amendment proposals. The proposed amendments to the IHR that are currently being considered by Member States are still under negotiation. While the outcomes of these efforts are not yet determined, Canada is ensuring that our sovereignty is maintained through any amendments to the IHR.

When negotiating a new international instrument or amendments to existing instruments, the Government of Canada always carefully considers its potential impact on Canada's domestic laws and policies. Evidence-informed decision-making and respect for national contexts are important principles for Canada. Canada has full jurisdiction for any future domestic decisions about national restrictions or other measures related to health emergencies and pandemics. The role of WHO has been and will continue to be advisory in nature, as WHO does not have jurisdiction in Canada. WHO Member States will continue to lead the process of negotiating amendments to the IHR (2005) and the Pandemic Instrument, and the federal government will ensure that Canadian priorities and values are upheld.

**Objet : Accord mondial sur la prévention, la préparation et la riposte face aux pandémies de l'OMS**

Monsieur Boileau,

Nous vous contactons car vous êtes représentant du Canada pour négocier l'accord mondial sur la prévention, la préparation et la riposte face aux pandémies de l'OMS. Bien que vous assuriez que vous porterez « toute l'attention nécessaire pour ce dossier et que votre priorité demeure la santé de la population dans le respect de ses droits et libertés », vous restez très vague.

Cette négociation se déroulant loin des regards et alors que les enjeux pour notre souveraineté sont majeurs, nos inquiétudes sont plus vives que jamais. Il nous paraît donc fondamental que vous répondiez de façon claire et précise aux questions suivantes qui concernent toutes les Québécoises et tous les Québécois.

**Question 1 : le Canada restera-t-il souverain?**

Tout d'abord, nous vous rappelons que cet **accord mondial sur la prévention, la préparation et la riposte face aux pandémies de l'OMS** devrait en principe être ratifié par les 194 pays membres au mois de mai 2024. Il ferait passer l'OMS d'un statut actuellement consultatif et technique à un statut d'autorité<sup>1</sup>. **L'OMS aurait donc des pouvoirs décisionnels outrepassant la souveraineté des États en période de pandémie.**

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## **pouvoirs décisionnels outrepassant la souveraineté des États en période de pandémie.**

Deux évènements particulièrement troublant s'ajoutent à ce changement fondamental :

- Tout d'abord, **les critères pour pouvoir déclarer une pandémie ont été allégés** à partir de mai 2009 (rappelons que la « pandémie » de grippe A H1N1 a été déclarée... le 11 juin 2009). La définition du mot pandémie est ainsi passée de (1) « Une pandémie est la propagation mondiale d'une épidémie caractérisée par un nombre énorme de morts et de malades » à (2) « Propagation mondiale d'une nouvelle maladie ». Cet opportun changement de définition permet ainsi à l'OMS de déclarer plus facilement un état de pandémie, en retirant de la définition l'élément clé du taux de mortalité, bref de la gravité.
- Ensuite, le nouveau traité sur les pandémies prévoit que le directeur général de l'OMS, donc **un seul homme, qui plus est non élu, pourra déclarer une pandémie à partir du moment où il considérera qu'une maladie constituerait une menace « potentielle » pour la santé humaine, animale transférable à l'homme et environnementale.**

Cela signifie que le Canada devra se conformer aux recommandations d'une seule personne. Si celle-ci décide de confinements ou de campagnes de vaccination obligatoires, il devra en théorie s'exécuter. S'il est toujours possible de dénoncer un traité, la pression internationale qui sera exercée lors d'une prochaine pandémie forcera de fait les États à se conformer.

**La santé étant de compétence provinciale, le Québec remet donc une partie de sa souveraineté entre les mains d'une personne non élue, hors du Québec et dont les intérêts peuvent diverger des nôtres.** Vous n'êtes pas sans savoir qu'il est fondamentalement dangereux de déléguer le contrôle de questions complexes ayant une forte incidence sur l'économie, la société et la santé publique à des personnes vivant dans un endroit éloigné, sans affiliation communautaire ou nationale pertinente, ni sans intérêt direct dans les résultats.

Selon vous, s'ils étaient au courant, les Québécois seraient-ils d'accord avec cela? **Pourriez-vous vous engager à défendre les intérêts des Québécoises et Québécois et donc à protéger leur souveraineté?**

Question 2 : qu'en est-il de nos droits et libertés?

Une seule personne, non élue, aura donc le pouvoir de décider si les Québécoises et les Québécois doivent se conformer aux directives de l'OMS, comme des confinements ou une vaccination obligatoire. Mais ce n'est pas tout puisque des questions majeures sur les droits et libertés se posent.

En effet, dans les premières versions du traité, il était clairement stipulé à l'article 3 que « Le présent règlement est mis en œuvre en respectant pleinement la dignité des



personnes, les droits de l'Homme et les libertés fondamentales. Cependant, dans la dernière version, sûrement très proche de celle qui sera soumise à l'Assemblée mondiale de la santé en mai, **la référence aux droits de l'Homme et aux libertés fondamentales a disparu**. Elle a été remplacée par des notions comme « l'équité » et « l'inclusivité ».

Vous conviendrez avec nous que ce changement de formulation est intrigant, pour ne pas dire inquiétant. Si l'OMS ne s'engage plus à respecter les droits de l'Homme et les libertés fondamentales, qu'est-ce que cela signifie? À quoi devrions-nous nous attendre?

**Pourriez-vous nous assurer que vous ferez tout ce qui est en votre pouvoir pour rétablir les mentions aux droits de l'Homme et aux libertés fondamentales?**

Question 3 : qu'en est-il de la liberté d'expression?

Au point C de l'article 1, le traité de l'OMS introduit la notion « d'infodémie » qui est d'après ce que l'on peut en lire dans le document « un excès d'informations et des informations fausses ou trompeuses ». Cette « situation » serait « source de confusion et [provoquerait] des comportements à risque susceptibles de nuire à la santé. Elle [conduirait] également à une méfiance à l'égard des autorités sanitaires et [saperait] les mesures sociales et de santé publique ».

Mais depuis quand « l'excès d'informations » constitue-t-il une menace? On en comprend que toute critique de l'OMS et des politiques de santé publique en temps de pandémie devrait donc être censurée. On sait pourtant que c'est le débat qui fait avancer la science et que de la confrontation des points de vue émerge les meilleures solutions. Dans une saine démocratie, les arguments sérieux l'emportent rapidement et les idées farfelues sont évacuées. Pourquoi alors s'évertuer à faire taire les paroles divergentes? Ce sont des mois, des années et des centaines voire des milliers de victimes qui pourraient être sauvées si un débat ouvert était de mise.

Comment est-il possible alors de trouver de tels propos dans ce traité, propos qui font déjà suite au retrait des droits de l'Homme et des libertés fondamentales? Ne trouvez-vous pas que cela commence à faire beaucoup? **Nous aimerions donc que vous vous engagiez à ce que les droits de l'Homme et les libertés fondamentales soient bien présents dans la version finale soumise au vote de l'Assemblée mondiale de la santé. Et inversement, que cette notion « d'infodémie » soit retirée car il s'agit d'une attaque inacceptable portée à la liberté d'expression.**

Question 4 : le passeport sanitaire mondial est-il légal et peut-il être justifié?

L'OMS a la volonté d'utiliser le certificat COVID numérique de l'Union européenne pour lancer un système de « certification numérique mondial ». Cela signifie qu'il faudra être à jour de tous ses vaccins pour pouvoir franchir une frontière. Ne serait-ce pas une disposition contraire et en contradiction à l'article 6 de la Charte Canadienne des Droits et libertés qui stipule pourtant que « Tout citoyen Canadien a le droit de demeurer au Canada, d'y entrer et d'en sortir »?

Nous vous rappelons aussi qu'il n'est pas démontré que les vaccins ont une quelconque efficacité. Par exemple, l'essai de Pfizer pour son vaccin contre la covid a été largement manipulé (cf. Christine Cotton : Tous vaccinés, tous protégés?) et il ne portait que sur la contamination et non pas sur la transmission et les formes graves comme cela a été répété faussement un nombre incalculable de fois. Depuis, les propres données de la Santé publique du Québec montrent une efficacité négative de cette injection<sup>2</sup>.

De même, alors qu'il en est beaucoup question, aucune étude aléatoire en double aveugle contre placebo n'a montré une quelconque efficacité du vaccin contre la rougeole (alors que les données montrent que la mortalité due à cette pathologie était quasiment rendue à zéro avant l'introduction du vaccin). Cela ne signifie pas que ce vaccin est inefficace. Mais cela montre en l'état qu'il est impossible de conclure à une quelconque efficacité vaccinale.

En outre, au Québec, l'article 5 de la Loi concernant les soins de fin de vie est très clair. Il stipule que toute personne majeure et capable de consentir aux soins a le droit de refuser un traitement nécessaire pour maintenir sa vie ou de retirer son consentement à un tel traitement. Un passeport vaccinal, mondial ou non, contrevient directement à cette loi ainsi qu'à d'autres règlements, lois et traités internationaux (comme la Déclaration d'Helsinki) tout en ne reposant sur aucune étude solide. **Dans ces conditions, pourriez-vous nous assurer que vous combattrez ce projet qui restreint la liberté de circulation des Canadiens en créant deux catégories de citoyens, ce qui institue de fait une ségrégation entre vaccinés et non vaccinés?**

## Question 5 : qu'en est-il de l'efficacité et de la souveraineté de l'OMS?

Les antécédents de l'OMS en matière de gestion des épidémies sont médiocres. Il n'y a qu'à se rappeler du bilan de la grippe A H1N1 dont nous avons traité plus haut. Si cela est aujourd'hui oublié, de nombreuses voix s'étaient fait entendre à l'époque pour blâmer l'OMS, qui avait surréagi<sup>3</sup>.

Ces mauvais résultats pourraient-ils s'expliquer par le fait que les intérêts privés exercent un pouvoir immense sur l'OMS puisqu'ils constituent la majorité de son financement? N'est-il pas problématique que son premier donateur soit Bill Gates (par l'intermédiaire de ses fondations Bill et Melinda Gates et GAVI)... alors que celui-ci ne se cache pas d'être un pro vaccin et dont on sait qu'il possède de nombreuses actions dans des compagnies qui vendent des vaccins? Le tout alors que la plupart des employés de l'OMS ont leur feuille de paie... au nom de la Fondation Bill et Melinda Gates<sup>4</sup>?

On comprend que les employés de l'OMS, au premier rang desquels on retrouve son directeur général, ne sont pas libres. Cela expose l'organisation à d'immenses conflits d'intérêt la détournant du but d'aider à soigner les populations, au profit de solutions davantage commerciales et globales, axées sur les pandémies et accordant beaucoup d'importance aux réponses pharmaceutiques, essentiellement vaccinales. Une unique solution vaccinale est-elle souhaitable, d'autant plus qu'il a été largement admis que la solution vaccinale à ARN messager priorisée durant la crise Covid-19, n'empêchait ni la transmission, ni la contagion? Et que dire de sa sécurité lorsque l'on consulte les instituts de pharmacovigilance à travers le monde?

**Face à cela, vous engagez-vous à faire tout ce qui est en votre pouvoir pour que ces questions fondamentales sur le financement de l'OMS et son indépendance soient solutionnées dans le traité sur les pandémies? Estimez-vous qu'il est acceptable que les dirigeants de cette organisation, qui va acquérir d'énormes pouvoirs, soient tenus par l'industrie pharmaceutique, voire son seul et si influent premier donateur?**

## Conclusion

Enfin, le traité sur les pandémies accordera à l'OMS des pouvoirs allant bien au-delà des réponses aux pandémies. En confiant à un seul homme, non élu et aux mains des lobbys, la possibilité de déclarer des pandémies, il nous apparaît que la subordination du Québec au traité sur les pandémies est contraire à la préservation et la protection de la santé de sa population. En effet, celles-ci sont garanties par la Charte des droits et libertés de la personne du Québec, ce qui commence par la liberté de faire un choix libre et éclairé de tout traitement médical ou le droit de décider des produits que nous acceptons de faire entrer dans notre corps. Le traité sur les pandémies viendrait mettre fin à cela, ce qui est illégal.

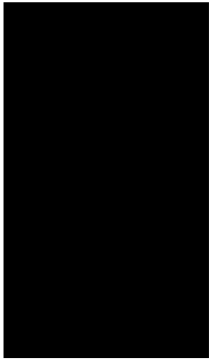

Hello ,  
Thank you for keeping us informed of the work that is occurring with the WHO. I have read quickly through the World Health Organization (WHO) Pandemic Agreement document and scanned the other links you provided. I appreciate all of your efforts to try to help us all do better as a collective, should a pandemic occur in the future. I have a few questions and comments, to which I would appreciate receiving a response.

- It is VERY important to me that nations retain their individual sovereignty to make decisions for their jurisdictions. It is VERY important to me that I retain the right to make health care decisions and choices that are right for me. If this is not the case, I do not support this work.

- Why is the term "vaccine" not defined in the Agreement document, so that we are all working from the same base understanding?

- There seems to be a large emphasis and focus on vaccines as the treatment choice. I find this to be narrow thinking. Other options, including natural sources and existing or historic medications, could be feasible. I would like to see the language broadened to be more inclusive of other possible options, in addition to vaccines and novel products.

- I was quite disturbed by how the term and process of "science" frequently was "used" by leaders during the most recent pandemic. A large and capable body of credible scientists were "shut down", "shut out" and "dismissed" as sources of misinformation (and other labels), rather than as the contributing, experienced, trustworthy, early and front-line "signal detectors" they ended up being. For science to be science, it demands challenge, discussion and the defence of ideas. I am very concerned when necessary and appropriate discourse, dialogue and challenges are stifled by leaders and/or are done behind closed doors. These elements are at the heart of science and need to occur, despite the fact that they may be "inconvenient" or "off message". Under such extreme circumstances as a pandemic and presentation of a novel medication, I am wary when the "science" upon which politicians are relying is not released for viewing and review, and is presented with a Public Relations "spin" to gain compliance. Further, it is my position that it is a very slippery slope into infringement of personal rights and health consequences if leaders dictate what health measures an individual must undertake, particularly with novel medications. I think the language used in the document related to the topic of science, particularly in Article 18 Communication, can be strengthened and improved to incorporate and address these concepts.

- Article 20: I know it is yet to be determined, but I am unclear as to how much funding will be provided to the WHO annually. To implement the contents of this document, the WHO will require a massive sum of money and a huge staff. There appear to be no limits on either. This appears to be a bottomless vacuum. As a taxpayer trying to make ends meet, this financial obligation to a non-elected administration is of concern.

- Article 27 Withdrawal and Article 28 Amendments: I would like to see this section revised so that a Country may immediately withdraw if their request for an amendment is not approved and their annual financial contribution prorated and credited back to them. I can envision circumstances which may warrant this.

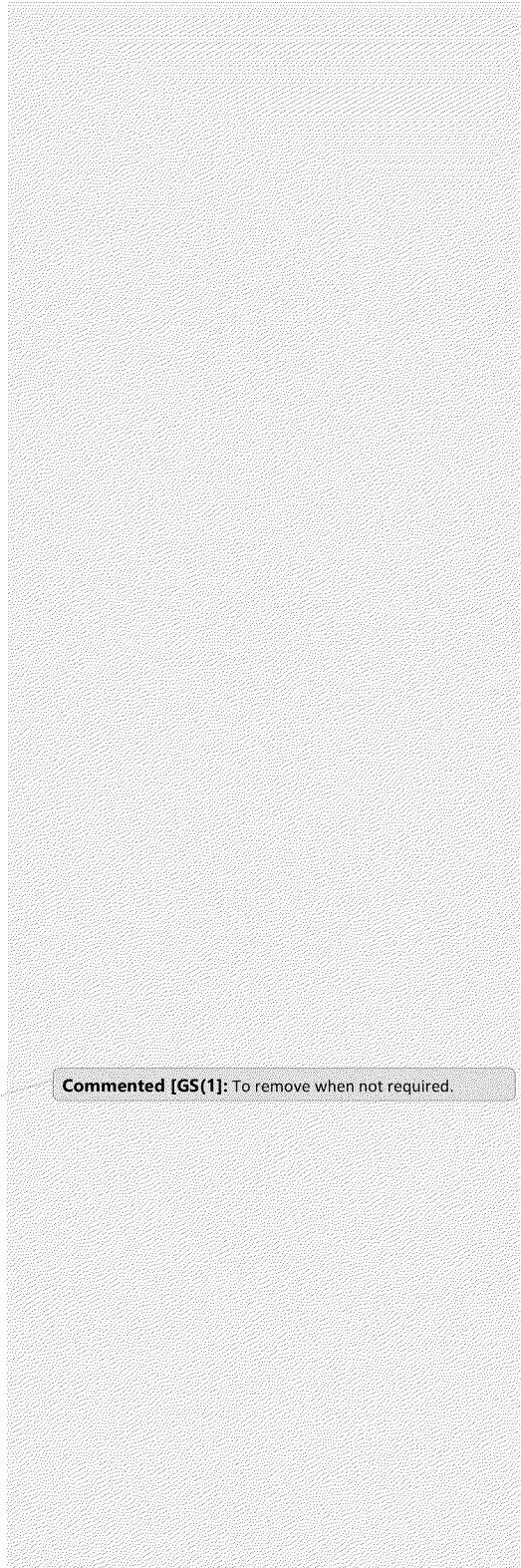

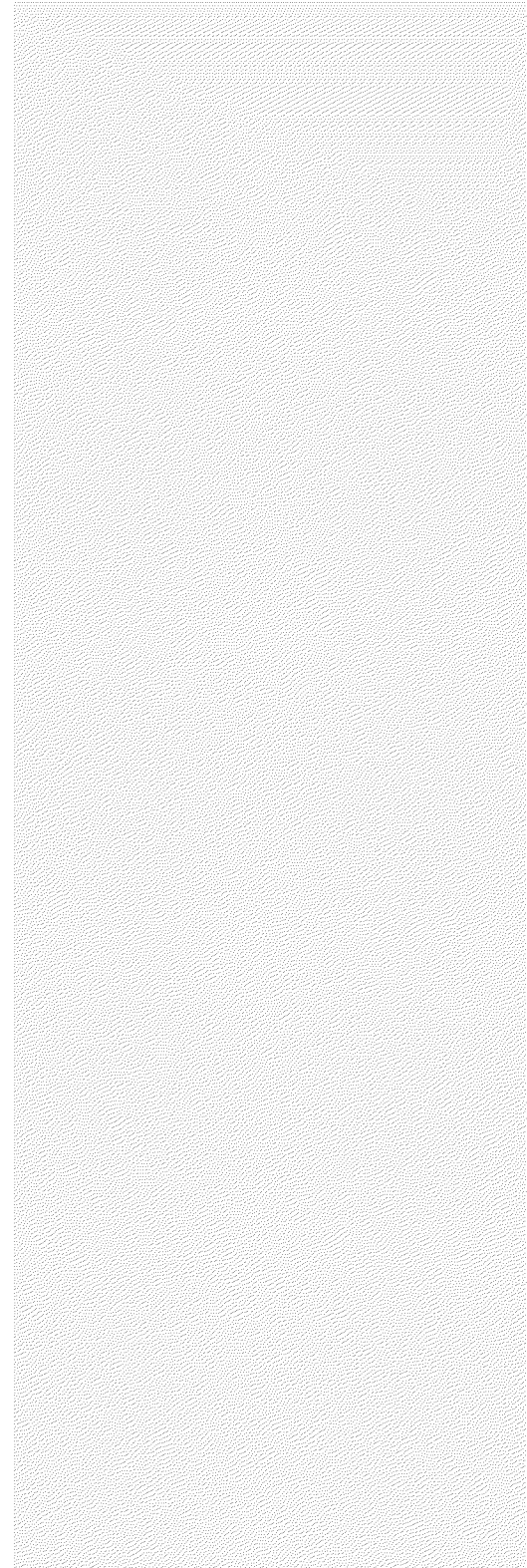



On behalf of the Honourable Mark Holland, Minister of Health, I wish to thank you for your correspondence of September 3, 2023 concerning the proposed amendments to the International Health Regulations (IHR) (2005).

Protecting the health and safety of all Canadians is a top priority of the Government of Canada. COVID-19 has demonstrated the need to take bold action to ensure we are better prepared for the next pandemic, which is why Canada is working closely with other countries and international partners, including the WHO, to strengthen pandemic prevention, preparedness and response.

Canada is a signatory to the IHR (2005), which are an important tool to keep Canadians healthy and safe through commitments and obligations that require countries to work together in a global health emergency. At the 75<sup>th</sup> World Health Assembly in May 2022, Member States, including Canada, agreed by consensus on a forward process to consider possible amendments to the IHR (2005). Member States themselves are leading the process and deciding on the content. As the starting point for this process, Member States were invited to submit amendment proposals. Proposed amendments are still under negotiation and none have been finalized or agreed upon.

Canada has full jurisdiction for any future domestic decisions about national restrictions or other measures related to health emergencies. The role of WHO has been and will continue to be advisory in nature, as WHO does not have jurisdiction in Canada. WHO Member States will continue to lead the process of negotiating amendments to the IHR (2005) and, as Canada engages in it, the federal government will ensure that Canadian priorities and values are upheld. It is expected that amendments to the IHR (2005) will be presented for consideration and potential adoption at the 77<sup>th</sup> World Health Assembly in May 2024.

In response to lessons learned from the COVID-19 pandemic, the WHO and its Member States, including Canada, are currently discussing two proposals: potential amendments to the International Health Regulations (2005) (IHR) and the development of a new international instrument, accord or treaty for pandemic prevention, preparedness and response; referred from hereon as a "pandemic instrument".

The IHR require countries to work together to prevent, protect against, control, and respond to the international spread of disease, while avoiding unnecessary interference with international traffic and trade. They are binding on the WHO and 196 countries, including Canada. States Parties to the IHR are currently considering potential amendments to the instrument as a means to bolster global health security. Canada supports and is actively engaged in the process to consider potential amendments to the IHR.

The IHR amendment process is complementary to, but separate from, the process underway to develop a new international pandemic instrument under the WHO. On December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021, a World Health Assembly Second Special Session was held where Member States, including Canada, agreed to establish an intergovernmental negotiating body (INB) to draft and negotiate a WHO pandemic instrument. More information on the pandemic instrument, including how to participate in the WHO public engagement process can be found here: <https://inb.who.int/>.

Canada supports the development of a new pandemic instrument to improve multilateral cooperation, enhance collective action and accountability and address gaps in pandemic

prevention, preparedness and response. Development of the pandemic instrument is still at an early stage and no draft text yet exists. Canada is taking a whole-of-government and whole-of-society approach to ensure that Canadian priorities and values are reflected as we continue to engage in this process. Member States will continue to lead the process to develop the instrument, which is expected to be presented at the 77th World Health Assembly in May 2024 for consideration and potential adoption.

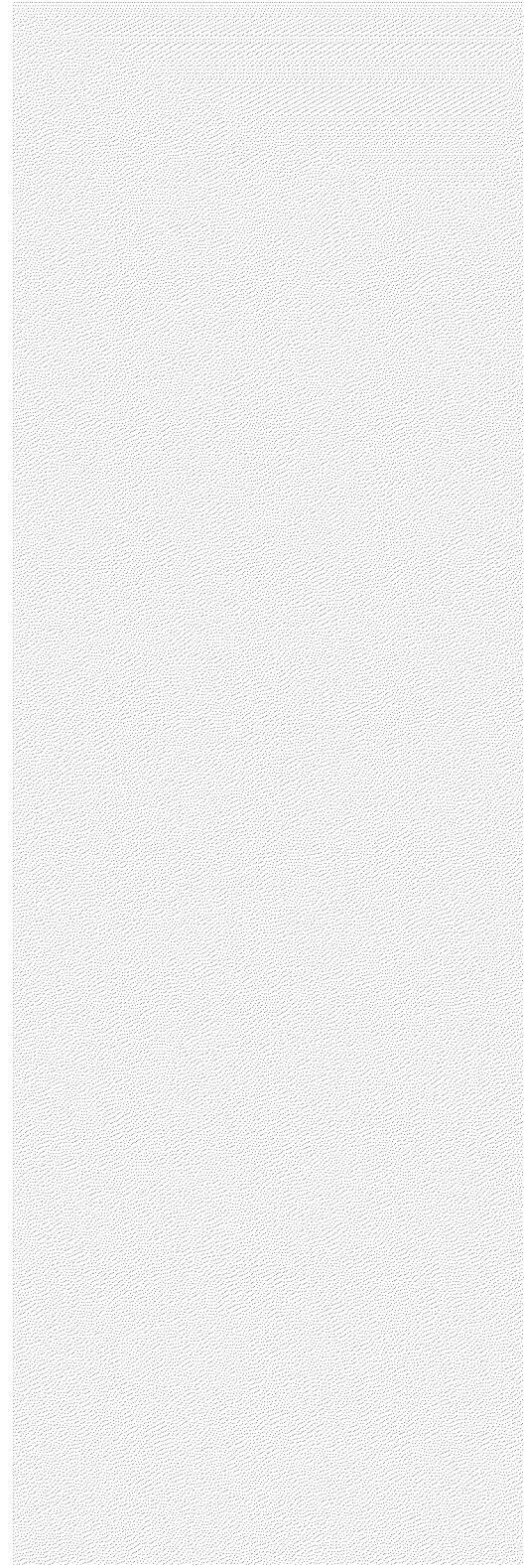

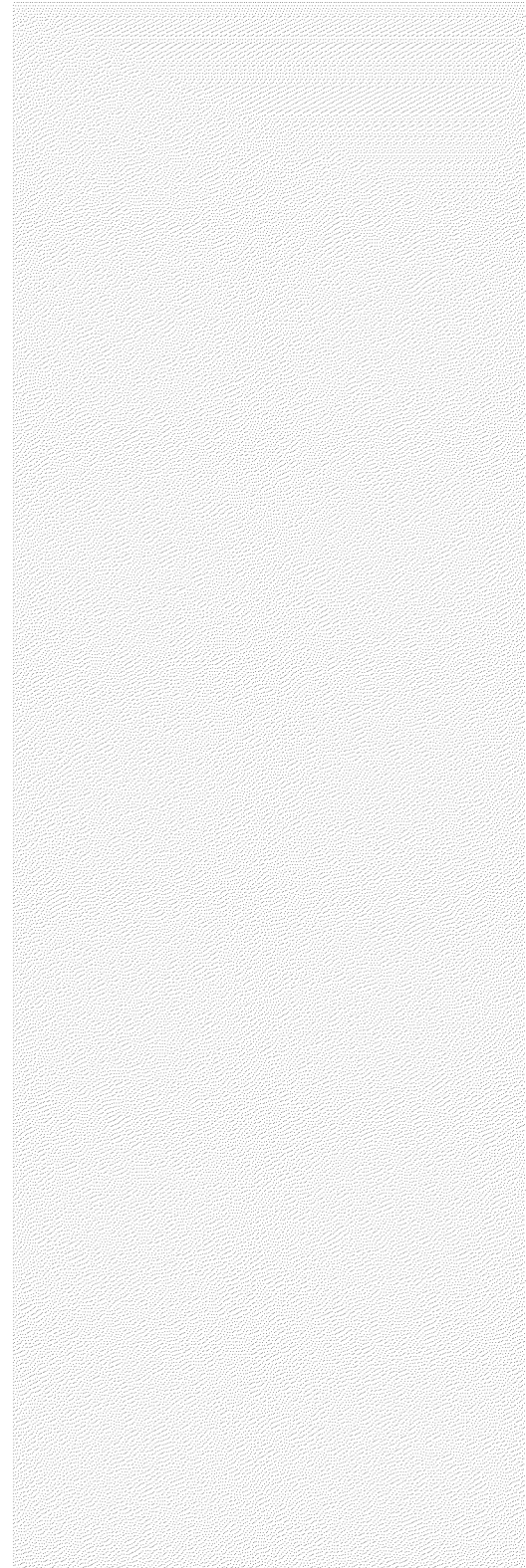

**Subject: Concerns About the WHO Pandemic Treaty During INB7**

We are writing on behalf of Canadian and Quebec unions that are members of Public Services International (PSI) that represent workers in health care. Collectively, we represent more than 500,000 workers who provide services in every aspect of our health care sector.

Our union is following the Intergovernmental Negotiating Body (INB) process to draft and negotiate an international agreement on pandemic prevention, preparedness, and response, also known as the WHO Pandemic Treaty. We have done this work with the support of Public Services International (PSI), the global union federation representing public services, health workers, and care workers around the world, to which we are affiliated.

We are concerned that the first session of the seventh round of discussions of the INB (INB7) held November 6–10 is not progressing adequately on key priorities for health workers and care workers. We urge your Ministry to address the points shared below during the resumed INB7 session December 4–8, 2023.

In addition, we would like to meet with you to be debriefed on the outcomes of INB7. With your support, this future instrument will build on the learnings and experience of health workers and care workers who were at the front lines during the Covid-19 pandemic.

## **Uphold the Right to Decent Work for Health Workers and Care Workers**

While we welcome the inclusion of an article on the workforce in health care and care work, in the current draft of the negotiating text, we are disappointed by its limited progress. Safe workers save lives. Yet, language in drafts prior to this negotiation stage that prioritized adequate protective equipment for front-line health workers during pandemics has been deleted.

## **It is imperative for countries to recognize the crucial work done by front-line workers during the pandemic and integrate this into the international accord (in Article 7) towards safeguarding the lives and health of health workers in the event of future health emergencies.**

Further, the current draft lacks substantial provisions that uphold decent work for all health workers and care workers, protect their health and safety, and recognize the essential role of front-line and migrant health workers and care workers.

### **We recommend the following:**

- Include in Article 1 **a broad definition of the health and care workforce**, which incorporates all workers classified as health workers by the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO) used by WHO.
- **Decent work** should also be incorporated into Article 3 as a guiding principle to be followed when developing, planning, and implementing any measures related to the preparedness, prevention, and response to a future pandemic.
- Article 7 must include provisions that will secure and protect the **labour rights of the health and care workforce**, including with reference to ILO Conventions 87 and 98.
- Article 7 must guarantee safe staff-to-patient ratios and other **minimum work and employment standards** as outlined in the [ILO Convention 149 on Nursing Personnel](#) and the [2017 ILO Tripartite Meeting on Improving Employment and Working Conditions in Health Services](#).
- Include a provision for **prioritizing Occupational Safety and Health** measures in Article 3 (guiding principles), including a reference to ILO Convention 155 and Resolution 164.
- Include **the precautionary principle** in Article 3 as a guiding principle, and substantive language in Article 7, so that the precautionary principle is applied when the cause-and-effect relationships are not fully established scientifically and there may be threats of harm to human health or the environment, particularly in the delivery of health care and care services during pandemics.

- Include in Article 7 provisions **to address injury, sequelae, or death** for health workers and care workers, as well as their families during pandemic response.
- Include clauses in Article 7 that hold both source and destination countries accountable for **protecting both the migrant workers and the health systems of sending countries.**

### **Ensure Public Financing for Public Goods**

In order to truly realize a robust, fair, and equitable global innovation system that will generate affordable and timely health technologies, we must understand health technologies (medical countermeasures) as public goods. Article 9.4 should guarantee that all health products, technologies, know-how, etc. that originate from publicly funded research programs **are kept in the public domain and cannot be patented.**

- Manufacturers of technologies that were developed with public funding must provide the resulting medical countermeasures on a **no profit/no loss** basis upon the announcement of a public health emergency of international concern (PHEIC).
- This should apply **regardless of the extent of public funding.**

The Covid-19 pandemic showed that we cannot rely on the voluntary agreements the private sector promotes. We need compulsory measures to ensure transparency of costs of R & D and future public contracts signed with private companies. An earlier draft (the pre-zero draft) included **compulsory measures** for entities that receive public funding for R & D in pandemic countermeasures **to disclose prices and contractual terms** of public procurement (Article 9.3.b). However, this measure—the only one that created an obligation for private entities—has been removed. **This should be put back**, i.e., included.

### **Waive Patent Rights in All Cases of Public Health Emergencies**

The COVID-19 pandemic has again shown that maintaining intellectual property privileges during a health crisis generates artificial scarcity and high prices, costing hundreds of thousands of lives, especially in the Global South. We cannot live through another health emergency by naturalizing monopolies and relying on voluntary solutions. The text must include **a binding and automatic mechanism** to waive intellectual property rights for technologies related to dealing with such an emergency immediately after a PHEIC is declared (in Article 11.3.(a)). Further, the future instrument should encourage countries to put in place **similar mechanisms at the national level.**

Further, countries are worried about implementing time-bound waivers unilaterally due to the **threats of legal action**. This had been addressed in an earlier version of the text that mentioned that parties couldn't challenge these measures. **We recommend this text be included in article 11.3.(a)**. Similarly, text that creates barriers to governments that are willing to put in place compulsory measures without the consent of patent and/or other intellectual property rights holders (i.e., "on mutually agreed terms") should be removed from the draft text.

Finally, we recommend the inclusion of provisions towards the review of relevant free trade agreements to remove TRIPS-plus measures, such as data protection, linkage, and patent term extension, amongst others.

### **Ensuring Everyone Shares and Everyone Benefits**

The inclusion of a Pathogen Access and Benefit Sharing system (PABS system, in Article 12) is an important learning from the mistakes of the global response to the Covid-19 pandemic. Yet, we are concerned that the concrete elements of this system are left unaddressed and are worried that such a gap can render this important effort meaningless. **We urge governments to maintain the same timeline for the PABS System as for the rest of the treaty.**

We require monetary and non-monetary obligations on the recipient of pathogen data (Recipients), and for governments to bear the responsibility to ensure that commitments are respected. We welcome the requirement for Recipients to provide WHO with real-time access to pandemic-related products, though **this should be based on a higher minimum (currently set at a minimum of 20%), as well as an appropriate distribution** based on a rolling assessment of evolving public health risks and needs. In addition, the 3 subsections of Article 12.4 (c) should be revised into **mandatory benefit-sharing conditions for the Recipients.**

### **Strengthen Health Systems to Prevent Health Emergencies**

Pandemic prevention, preparedness, and response require a global financial architecture that ensures that all countries have sufficient resources to inject into building strong and universal public health systems. We are concerned **that language on finance is weak**. The text should include the **principle of solidarity and a commitment to an Equitable International Order** (in article 3), as well as provisions towards equity in financing of pandemic prevention, preparedness, and response.

Further, the ILO has underlined the role of social dialogue in strengthening public services, including public health systems.<sup>1</sup> The European Commission document also highlights that "social dialogue is an essential tool for balanced crisis management and for finding effective mitigation and recovery policies," and that "experience shows that social dialogue contributes to effective crisis management."<sup>2</sup> **Article 6 should direct relevant actors to engage in social dialogue and governments to ensure active participation of unions and workers both in the planning and response during an emergency and in times of no pandemic.**

### **Inclusion of Climate Crisis**

We strongly recommend the inclusion of the climate crisis as a central priority to be considered in all pandemic and hazard preparedness and response programs. We further strongly recommend the need to prioritize improving health care resiliency in preparation for the ongoing climate crisis. In the zero draft of the pandemic treaty, the proposed "Article 5.(a). Strengthening pandemic prevention and preparedness through a One Health Approach" was the only article to mention climate change. **Article 5.(a) did not make it into the current draft. We strongly encourage its inclusion in addition to much stronger language about preparing for health hazards in the context of our ongoing climate crisis.**

Our current health care system is unprepared to respond to both current and future hazards created by the ongoing climate crisis. The pandemic treaty presents an opportunity to hold governments to account to invest in programs that would improve the resiliency of our health care infrastructure, protect the health care workforce during climate disasters, and support research into the health impacts of climate change.

We urge the negotiators to incorporate the climate crisis (and specifically, the extreme weather disasters that are caused by climate change), as hazards that require attention and funding. We encourage the negotiators to include the creation of funding programs to invest in construction projects to improve the resilience and pre-disaster mitigation of our health care infrastructure. Finally, we urge the negotiators to require investment in occupational health and safety programs and hazard pay for health care workers during any extreme weather event.





**Objet: Inquiétudes concernant le Traité de l'OMS sur les pandémies pendant l'OINB7**

Monsieur le Ministre,

Nous vous écrivons au nom des organisations syndicales québécoises et canadiennes qui sont affiliées à l'Internationale des Services publics qui représente les travailleuses et travailleurs du secteur de la santé. Collectivement, nous représentons plus de 500 000 travailleuses et travailleurs qui fournissent des services dans tous les aspects du secteur de la santé et des services sociaux.

Notre syndicat participe au processus de l'organe intergouvernemental de négociation (OIN) afin de rédiger et négocier un accord international sur la prévention, la préparation et l'intervention en cas de pandémie, intitulé Traité de l'OMS sur les pandémies. Nous avons effectué ce travail avec le soutien de l'Internationale des Services Publics (ISP), la fédération syndicale internationale représentant les travailleuses et travailleurs des services publics, de la santé et des soins à travers le monde, à laquelle nous sommes affiliés.

Nous sommes préoccupés par le fait que la première session du septième cycle de discussion de l'OIN (OIN7) qui s'est tenue du 6 au 10 novembre ne progresse pas de manière adéquate sur les priorités clés pour les travailleuses et travailleurs de la santé et des soins. Nous demandons instamment à votre ministère d'aborder les points partagés ci-dessous lors des prochaines sessions de l'OIN.

En outre, nous sollicitons un rendez-vous avec vous pour faire le point sur les résultats de l'OIN7. Avec votre soutien, ce futur instrument s'appuiera sur les enseignements et l'expérience des travailleuses et travailleurs de la santé et des soins qui étaient en première ligne lors de la pandémie de Covid-19.

## **DÉFENDRE LE DROIT À UN TRAVAIL DÉCENT POUR LES TRAVAILLEUSES ET TRAVAILLEURS DE LA SANTÉ ET DES SOINS**

Si nous nous félicitons de l'inclusion d'un article sur le personnel de santé et de soins dans le projet actuel de texte de négociation, nous sommes déçus par ses progrès limités. Des travailleuses et travailleurs en sécurité sauvent des vies, et pourtant, la formulation qui donnait la priorité à un équipement de protection adéquat pour les travailleuses et travailleurs de santé de première ligne pendant les pandémies dans les projets antérieurs à cette phase de négociation a été supprimée. **Il est impératif que les pays reconnaissent le travail crucial effectué par les travailleuses et travailleurs de première ligne pendant la pandémie et l'intègrent dans l'accord international (à l'Article 7), afin de préserver la vie et la santé des travailleuses et travailleurs de la santé en cas de futures urgences sanitaires.**

En outre, le projet actuel ne contient pas de dispositions substantielles qui garantissent un travail décent à tous les travailleuses et travailleurs de la santé et des soins, protègent leur santé et leur sécurité et reconnaissent le rôle essentiel des travailleuses de la santé et des soins de première ligne et des travailleurs.euses migrant.e.s.

### **Nous recommandons :**

- D'inclure dans l'Article 1 **une définition large du personnel de santé et de soins** qui incorpore tous les travailleuses et travailleurs désignés comme travailleuses et travailleurs de la santé par la classification internationale type des professions (CITP) utilisée par l'OMS.
- **Le travail décent** devrait également être intégré à l'Article 3 en tant que principe directeur à suivre lors de l'élaboration, de la planification et de la mise en œuvre de toute mesure liée à la préparation, à la prévention et à la réponse à une future pandémie.
- L'Article 7 doit inclure des dispositions qui garantissent et protègent les **droits du travail du personnel de santé et de soins**, y compris en référence aux Conventions C87 et C98 de l'OIT.



- L'Article 7 doit garantir des ratios personnel-patient sûrs et d'autres **normes minimales de travail et d'emploi**, comme indiqué dans la Convention C149 de l'OIT sur le personnel infirmier et la Réunion tripartite de l'OIT de 2017 sur l'amélioration des conditions d'emploi et de travail dans les services de santé.
- L'inclusion d'une disposition relative à la **hiérarchisation des mesures de sécurité et de santé au travail** à l'Article 3 (principes directeurs), y compris une référence à la Convention C155 de l'OIT et à la Recommandation R164.
- L'inclusion du **principe de précaution** à l'Article 3 en tant que principe directeur, et une formulation substantielle à l'Article 7 afin que le principe de précaution soit appliqué lorsque les relations de cause à effet ne sont pas entièrement établies scientifiquement et qu'il peut y avoir des menaces de dommages pour la santé humaine ou l'environnement, en particulier dans la fourniture de services de santé et de soins pendant les pandémies.
- L'inclusion à l'Article 7 de dispositions **relatives aux blessures, séquelles ou décès** des travailleuses et travailleurs de la santé et des soins, ainsi que de leurs familles, lors d'une intervention en cas de pandémie.
- L'inclusion de clauses (à l'Article 7) qui rendent les pays d'origine et de destination responsables de la **protection des travailleuses et travailleurs migrants et des systèmes de santé des pays d'origine**.

## ASSURER LE FINANCEMENT PUBLIC DES BIENS PUBLICS

Afin de mettre en place un système d'innovation mondial solide, juste et équitable qui génère des technologies de la santé abordables et opportunes, nous devons considérer les technologies de la santé (contre-mesures médicales) comme des biens publics. L'Article 9.4 devrait garantir que tous les produits de santé, technologies, savoir-faire, etc., issus de programmes de recherche financés par le secteur public, **restent dans le domaine public et ne peuvent être brevetés**.

- Les fabricants de technologies développées à l'aide de fonds publics doivent fournir les contre-mesures médicales qui en résultent, **sans profit ni perte**, dès l'annonce d'une catastrophe écologique majeure.
- Cette règle devrait s'appliquer **quelle que soit l'ampleur du financement public**.

La pandémie de Covid-19 a montré que nous ne pouvons pas nous fier aux accords volontaires que le secteur privé promet. Nous avons besoin de mesures obligatoires pour garantir la transparence des coûts de R&D et des futurs contrats publics signés avec des entreprises privées. Un projet antérieur (l'avant-projet zéro) prévoyait des **mesures obligatoires** pour les laboratoires qui reçoivent des fonds publics pour la R&D en matière de contre-mesures pandémiques, **afin de divulguer les prix et les conditions contractuelles** des marchés publics (Article 9.3.b). Toutefois, cette mesure - la seule qui créait une obligation pour les entreprises privées - a été supprimée. ***Elle devrait être réintroduite.***

### **RENONCER AUX DROITS DE BREVET DANS TOUS LES CAS D'URGENCE EN MATIÈRE DE SANTÉ PUBLIQUE**

La pandémie de COVID-19 a montré une fois de plus que le maintien des privilèges de la propriété intellectuelle pendant une crise sanitaire génère une pénurie artificielle et des prix élevés, coûtant des centaines de milliers de vies, en particulier dans les pays du Sud global. Nous ne pouvons pas vivre une autre urgence sanitaire en naturalisant les monopoles et en nous reposant sur des solutions volontaires. Le texte doit inclure **un mécanisme contraignant et automatique** de renonciation aux droits de propriété intellectuelle pour les technologies liées à la gestion d'une telle urgence immédiatement après la déclaration d'une USPP (à l'Article 11.3.(a)). En outre, le futur instrument devrait encourager les pays à mettre en place des **mécanismes similaires au niveau national**.

En outre, les pays s'inquiètent de la mise en œuvre unilatérale de dérogations limitées dans le temps en raison de la **menace d'une action en justice**. Cette question avait été abordée dans une version antérieure du texte qui mentionnait que les *parties ne pouvaient pas contester ces mesures*. ***Nous recommandons que ce texte soit réintroduit dans l'Article 11.3.(a)***. De même, le texte qui empêche les gouvernements prêts à mettre en place des mesures obligatoires sans le consentement des détenteurs de brevets et/ou d'autres droits de propriété intellectuelle (c'est-à-dire "à des conditions convenues d'un commun accord") devrait être supprimé du projet de texte.

Enfin, nous recommandons l'inclusion de dispositions relatives à la révision des accords de libre-échange pertinents afin de supprimer les mesures ADPIC-plus, telles que la protection des données, la liaison, l'extension de la durée des brevets, entre autres.

## VEILLER À CE QUE TOUT LE MONDE BÉNÉFICIE DES AVANTAGES

L'inclusion d'un système d'Accès aux Agents Pathogènes et de Bénéfices Partagés (système PABS, à l'Article 12) est une leçon importante tirée des erreurs de la réponse mondiale à la pandémie de Covid-19. Cependant, nous sommes préoccupés par le fait que les éléments concrets de ce système ne sont pas abordés et nous craignons qu'une telle lacune ne vide de son sens cet effort important. ***Nous demandons instamment aux gouvernements de maintenir le même calendrier pour le système PABS que pour le reste du traité.***

Nous demandons que des obligations monétaires et non monétaires soient imposées aux bénéficiaires des données sur les agents pathogènes et que les gouvernements assument la responsabilité de veiller à ce que ces engagements soient respectés. Nous saluons l'obligation faite aux bénéficiaires de fournir à l'OMS un accès en temps réel aux produits liés à la pandémie, bien que ***cette obligation doive être fondée sur un minimum plus élevé (actuellement fixé à un minimum de 20 %), ainsi que sur une répartition appropriée*** fondée sur une évaluation continue de l'évolution des risques et des besoins en matière de santé publique. En outre, les trois sous-sections de l'Article 12.4 (c) devraient être révisées pour devenir des ***conditions obligatoires de partage des avantages pour les bénéficiaires.***

## RENFORCER LES SYSTÈMES DE SANTÉ POUR PRÉVENIR LES URGENCES SANITAIRES

La prévention, la préparation et la réponse aux pandémies nécessitent une structure financière mondiale qui garantisse que tous les pays disposent de ressources suffisantes à injecter dans la mise en place de systèmes de santé publique solides et universels. Nous sommes préoccupés par la ***faiblesse du langage sur le financement.*** Le texte devrait inclure le ***principe de solidarité et un engagement en faveur d'un ordre international équitable*** (à l'Article 3), ainsi que des dispositions en faveur de l'équité dans le financement de la prévention, de la préparation et de la riposte aux pandémies.

En outre, l'OIT a souligné le rôle du dialogue social dans le renforcement des services publics, y compris les systèmes de santé publique<sup>1</sup>. Le document de la Commission européenne<sup>2</sup> souligne également que "le dialogue social est un outil

essentiel pour une gestion équilibrée des crises et pour trouver des politiques efficaces d'atténuation et de relance" et que "l'expérience montre que le dialogue social contribue à une gestion efficace des crises". **L'Article 6 devrait enjoindre aux acteurs concernés de s'engager dans le dialogue social et aux gouvernements de garantir la participation active des syndicats et des travailleuses et travailleurs tant dans la planification que dans la réponse à apporter pendant une situation d'urgence et en dehors d'une pandémie.**

## **INCLUSION DE LA CRISE CLIMATIQUE**

Nous recommandons fortement d'inclure la crise climatique comme une priorité centrale à considérer dans tous les programmes de préparation et de réponse aux pandémies et aux risques. Nous recommandons en outre fortement de donner la priorité à l'amélioration de la résilience des soins de santé en prévision de la crise climatique actuelle. Dans l'avant-projet du traité sur la pandémie, le projet « Article 5.A. Renforcer la prévention et la préparation aux pandémies grâce à une approche « Une seule santé » était le seul article à mentionner le changement climatique.

**Toutefois, l'article 5.A ne figure plus dans le projet actuel. Nous encourageons fortement son inclusion en utilisant des termes beaucoup plus forts quant à la préparation aux risques sanitaires dans le contexte de la crise climatique actuelle.** Notre système de santé actuel n'est pas préparé à répondre aux dangers actuels et futurs créés par la crise climatique actuelle. Le traité sur la pandémie offre l'occasion de demander des comptes aux gouvernements pour qu'ils investissent dans des programmes qui amélioreraient la résilience de nos infrastructures de soins de santé, protégeraient le personnel soignant lors de catastrophes climatiques et soutiendraient la recherche sur les impacts du changement climatique sur la santé.

Nous exhortons les négociateurs à intégrer la crise climatique (et plus particulièrement les catastrophes météorologiques extrêmes provoquées par le changement climatique) comme un danger qui nécessite attention et financement. Nous encourageons les négociateurs à inclure la création de programmes de financement pour investir dans des projets de construction afin d'améliorer la résilience et l'atténuation des risques de catastrophe de notre infrastructure de soins de santé. Enfin, nous exhortons les négociateurs à exiger des investissements dans des programmes de santé et de sécurité au travail et une prime de risque pour les travailleurs de la santé lors de tout événement météorologique extrême.

Les négociations entrent maintenant dans une phase clé. Nous comptons sur votre soutien et restons à votre disposition pour toute question.

Nous vous prions d'agréer, Monsieur le Ministre, l'expression de nos sentiments distingués.

On behalf of the Honourable Jean-Yves Duclos, Minister of Health, I wish to thank you for your correspondence of January 3, 2023 concerning the development of a new World Health Organization (WHO) convention, agreement or other international instrument on pandemic prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery ("pandemic instrument") and the amendments to the International Health Regulations (IHR) (2005).

Protecting the health and safety of all Canadians is a top priority of the Government of Canada. COVID-19 has demonstrated the need to take bold action to ensure we are better prepared for the next pandemic, which is why Canada is working closely with international partners, including the WHO, the Pan-American Health Organization (PAHO) and the global community to strengthen global pandemic prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery. This includes actively participating in the development of a pandemic instrument and the IHR (2005) amendment process. The final outcomes of both processes are expected to be presented at the 77th World Health Assembly in May 2024 for consideration and potential adoption.

Development of the pandemic instrument is intended to improve global cooperation, strengthen collective action and accountability and address gaps in pandemic prevention, preparedness and response. More information on Canada's role in the development of the pandemic instrument can be found here:

The process to amend the IHR (2005) is separate but complementary to the development of a pandemic instrument. Canada is a signatory to the IHR (2005), a legally binding international agreement, which came into force in 2007. Fulfilling our responsibilities and obligations under the IHR has not impinged Canadian sovereignty and has helped to protect the health and safety of Canadians. When negotiating a new international instrument or amendments to existing instruments, the Government of Canada always carefully considers its potential impact on Canada's domestic laws and policies. Evidence-informed decision-making and respect for national contexts are important principles for Canada. As with the existing IHR, Canada will seek to ensure that any amendments to the IHR, as well as the development of a new pandemic instrument continue to respect the national health, social, economic, security and political context of all signing parties. Canada will remain in control of any future domestic decisions about national restrictions or other measures related to pandemics.

In the process to develop the pandemic instrument and amend the IHR (2005), both Canada and the WHO are committed to transparently and inclusively engaging stakeholders. To date, Canada's engagement has included virtual meetings and written correspondence, which continue to inform the development of Canada's positions. We have also encouraged stakeholders to participate in the WHO's public consultations on the development of a pandemic instrument; more information on the WHO's process can be found here: <https://inb.who.int/>. The Government of Canada will continue to engage with civil society, academics, Indigenous partners, the private sector, and provincial and territorial partners to advance Canadian values and priorities.

I respectfully raise the critical issue of the proposed International Treaty on Pandemic Prevention and Preparedness and the proposed amendments to the International Health Regulations (IHR) <sup>[1]</sup> currently under negotiation by the Government and other member States of the World Health Organization (WHO). We call on you to oppose these proposed agreements by raising this issue *in Parliament*, demanding debate and open review, in the interests of preserving national sovereignty and individual rights.

These agreements seek to impose WHO dictates in place of national sovereignty and the rights of an individual to make choices regarding their own body and health, and is demonstrably inappropriate and disproportionate from a public health viewpoint.

### **Basic principles governing public health**

The breadth of factors impacting an individual's health, and the importance of personal, community and national control over health, are reflected in principles previously accepted by the World Health Organization:

Definition of health: *Health is a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity.* (Constitution of the WHO, 1946) <sup>[2]</sup>

*Informed opinion and active co-operation on the part of the public are of the utmost importance in the improvement of the health of the people. (Constitution of the WHO, 1946) [2]*

This underlines the importance of national and local control in time of disease outbreaks to ensure long-term harms do not outweigh intended short-term benefit, responses are in line with population priorities, and free of conflict of interest.

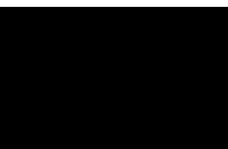

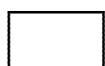

On behalf of the Jean-Yves Duclos, Minister of Health, I wish to thank you for your correspondence of February 27, 2023 concerning the development of a new World Health Organization (WHO) convention, agreement or other international instrument on pandemic prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery ("pandemic instrument") and the amendments to the International Health Regulations (IHR) (2005).

Protecting the health and safety of all Canadians is a top priority of the Government of Canada. COVID-19 has demonstrated the need to take bold action to ensure we are better prepared for the next pandemic, which is why Canada is working closely with international partners, including the WHO, the Pan-American Health Organization (PAHO) and the global community to strengthen global pandemic prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery. This includes actively participating in the development of a pandemic instrument. The Government of Canada will work to ensure that Canadian priorities and values are reflected as we continue to engage in this process. Member States will continue to lead the process to develop the instrument, which is expected to be presented at the 77th World Health Assembly in May 2024 for consideration and potential adoption.

When negotiating a new international instrument or amendments to existing instruments, the Government of Canada always carefully considers its potential impact on Canada's domestic laws and policies. Evidence-informed decision-making and respect for national contexts are important principles for Canada. As with the existing IHR, Canada will seek to ensure that any amendments to the IHR, as well as the development of a new pandemic instrument continue to respect the national health, social, economic, security and political context of all signing parties. Canada will remain in control of any future domestic decisions about national restrictions or other measures related to pandemics.

Thank you very much for your recent message regarding negotiations for a new World Health Organization (WHO) Pandemic Agreement. I have read the proposal and would like to share here the following few comments for your consideration.

1. Although the document mentions in various occasions the need to follow "science-based actions", it does not go far enough to request or to propose the need to adopt, and to take "evidence-based decisions". Since science is frequently being attacked today, the need of using good quality evidence as a condition for decisions should be strongly recommended.
2. International Regulations already request reassessment of pandemic prevention and preparedness procedures every five years, but most countries do not comply with them. Is there something else to consider?
3. Although the document rightly includes a call for the strengthening of Clinical Trial related procedures, it fails to request following well-accepted International Standards (e.g. ICH Good Clinical Practices) for the studies. Failing to follow them could lead to accepting higher risks for participants, and ultimately the waste of resources. This is particularly true when considering product quality during all phases of development of pandemic products.
4. Somehow related to the previous point, the discussions in Article 14 on Regulatory Strengthening seem to be limited to having fast approval processes and the implementation of regulatory reliance, and there is no discussion on the quality of those decisions. Both the quality and the effectiveness of the regulatory assessment processes need to be considered and strengthened.

I hope you will consider these comments further and thank you very much for your attention to this matter,

**How can you, as the Chief Negotiator for the Pandemic Treaty on behalf of the Public Health Agency of Canada, justify that all these negotiations are being conducted in total secrecy without the ability for Canadians (who will inherently be directly affected by the Treaty and Amended IHRs should they be implemented in Canada) to have any input or knowledge about them?**

The Government of Canada appreciates that it is engaging in these negotiations on behalf of Canadians, which is why we have consulted widely and continue to ensure our work is transparent and reflective of the feedback we have received to date from citizens and organizations across the country. To ensure that the Pandemic Agreement reflects Canadian priorities, objectives and values, the Government of Canada held a *Pandemic Instrument Partner and Stakeholder Engagement Forum* on March 21 and 22, 2023. The Forum took place in a hybrid format, welcoming 94 in-person participants in Ottawa and an additional 70 online. Attendees represented the following sectors: academics, experts and researchers (27%); non-governmental organizations and not-for-profits (28%); health and allied health services (14%); the private sector (13%); provincial, territorial, and Indigenous departments of health and health authorities (12%); and youth (6%).

Additionally, from January 29 to February 12, 2024, the Government of Canada hosted the *Pandemic Agreement Regional Engagement Series*. These engagements were an opportunity to gather partner and stakeholder input on the negotiating text of the WHO Pandemic Agreement. The engagement sessions were held in Halifax, Montreal, Toronto, Vancouver, Whitehorse and Winnipeg using a combination of in-person, virtual and hybrid formats, with a total of 75 individuals attending in person and 41 attending online. Representation spanned diverse sectors, including provincial and territorial governments, Indigenous organizations, academia, public and private sectors, civil society, and associations. Attendees identified articles of relevance to their organizations and provided input on practicality and potential challenges during implementation.

The Government of Canada posted a [report](#) summarizing the discussions on its Pandemic Agreement [webpage](#) and routinely updates the website, as appropriate. Additionally, all meetings of the WHO's International Negotiating Body are documented [here](#), including related documentation and videos of the proceedings.

These forums are just one element of Canada's partner and stakeholder engagement supporting the development of the Pandemic Agreement. Opportunities for partner and stakeholder engagement will continue, including via future meetings and written input. The information, views, and perspectives shared by partners and stakeholders will continue to inform Canada's involvement in the development of a Pandemic Agreement.

Canada, as a WHO Member State, has actively participated in the development of the Pandemic Agreement, recognizing the necessity of a robust global health security architecture. Canada is taking a whole-of-government, whole-of-society approach in the development of the Pandemic Agreement. Our Partner and Stakeholder Engagement Strategy aims to facilitate meaningful and inclusive engagement from provinces and territories, Indigenous organizations, academics and experts, civil society organizations, private sector, and youth, while promoting transparency of negotiation processes.

Canada has also been engaging in negotiations to amend the IHR (2005), and information on IHR (2005) has been posted to the Government of Canada website [here](#). The federal government has engaged with provinces and territories and global health partners and stakeholders throughout this process. Canada will continue to uphold Canadian priorities and values and will maintain national sovereignty through any amendments to the IHR (2005).

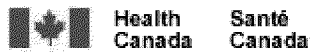

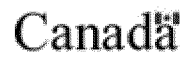

On behalf of the Honourable Mark Holland, Minister of Health, I wish to thank you for your correspondence of September 3, 2023 concerning the proposed amendments to the International Health Regulations (IHR) (2005).

Protecting the health and safety of all Canadians is a top priority of the Government of Canada. COVID-19 has demonstrated the need to take bold action to ensure we are better prepared for the next pandemic, which is why Canada is working closely with other countries and international partners, including the WHO, to strengthen pandemic prevention, preparedness, and response and recovery. Along with working to strengthen the IHR (2005), Canada is also working with over 190 other countries to develop a new WHO convention, agreement or other international instrument on pandemic prevention, preparedness, and response

Canada is a signatory to the IHR (2005), which are an important tool to keep Canadians healthy and safe through commitments and obligations that require countries to work together in a global health emergency. At the 75<sup>th</sup> World Health Assembly in May 2022, Member States, including Canada, agreed by consensus on a forward process to consider possible amendments to the IHR (2005). Member States themselves are leading the process and deciding on the content. As the starting point for this process, Member States were invited to submit amendment proposals. Proposed amendments are still under negotiation and none have been finalized or agreed upon.

Canada has full jurisdiction for any future domestic decisions about national restrictions or other measures related to health emergencies and pandemics. The role of WHO has been and will continue to be advisory in nature, as WHO does not have jurisdiction in Canada. WHO Member States will continue to lead the process of negotiating amendments to the IHR (2005) and, as Canada engages in it, the federal government will ensure that Canadian priorities and values are upheld. It is expected that amendments to the IHR (2005) will be presented for consideration and potential adoption at the 77<sup>th</sup> World Health Assembly in May 2024.

Protecting the health and safety of all Canadians is a top priority of the Government of Canada. COVID-19 has demonstrated the need to take bold action to ensure we are better prepared for the next pandemic, which is why Canada is working closely with international partners to strengthen global pandemic prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery. This includes actively participating in the development of a pandemic instrument. The Government of Canada will work to ensure that Canadian priorities and values are reflected as we continue to engage in this process. Member States will continue to lead the process to develop the instrument, which is expected to be presented at the 77th World Health Assembly in May 2024 for consideration and potential adoption.

When negotiating a new international instrument or amendments to existing instruments, the Government of Canada always carefully considers its potential impact on Canada’s domestic laws and policies. Evidence-informed decision-making and respect for national contexts are important principles for Canada. As with the existing IHRs, Canada will seek to ensure that any amendments to the IHRs, as well as the development of a new pandemic instrument continue to respect the national health, social, economic, security and political context of all signing parties. Canada will remain in control of any future domestic decisions about national restrictions or other measures related to pandemics.

Protecting the health and safety of all Canadians is a top priority of the Government of Canada. COVID-19 has demonstrated the need to take bold action to ensure we are better prepared for the next pandemic, which is why Canada is working closely with international partners, including the WHO, the Pan-American Health Organization (PAHO) and the global community to strengthen global pandemic prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery. This includes actively participating in the development of a pandemic instrument. The Government of Canada will work to ensure that Canadian priorities and values are reflected as we continue to engage in this process. Member States will continue to lead the process to develop the ~~instrument~~Instrument, which is expected to be presented at the 77th World Health Assembly in May 2024 for consideration and potential adoption.

When negotiating a new international instrument or amendments to existing instruments, the Government of Canada always carefully considers its potential impact on Canada's domestic laws and policies. Evidence-informed decision-making and respect for national contexts are important principles for Canada. As with the existing IHRs, Canada will seek to ensure that any amendments to the IHRs, as well as the development of a new pandemic instrument continue to respect the national health, social, economic, security and political context of all signing parties. Canada will remain in control of any future domestic decisions about national restrictions or other measures related to pandemics.

***How can you, as the Chief Negotiator for the Pandemic Treaty on behalf of the Public Health Agency of Canada, justify that all these negotiations are being conducted in total secrecy without the ability for Canadians (who will inherently be directly affected by the Treaty and Amended IHRs should they be implemented in Canada) to have any input or knowledge about them?***

Previously approved media response from August 2023:

Canada is taking a whole-of-government, whole-of-society approach in the development of the pandemic instrument. Our Partner and Stakeholder Engagement Strategy aims to facilitate meaningful and inclusive engagement from provinces and territories, Indigenous organizations, academics and experts, civil society organizations, private sector, and youth, while promoting transparency of negotiation processes.

To ensure that the pandemic instrument reflects Canadian priorities, objectives and values, the Government of Canada held a *Pandemic Instrument Partner and Stakeholder Engagement Forum* from March 21 to 22, 2023. The Forum took place in a hybrid format, welcoming 94 in-person participants in Ottawa and an additional 70 online. Attendees represented the following sectors: academics, experts and researchers (27%); non-governmental organizations and not-for-profits (28%); health and allied health services (14%); the private sector (13%); provincial, territorial, and Indigenous departments of health and health authorities (12%); and youth (6%).

Participants discussed leadership and governance; capacities to detect, understand and act on public health emergencies; health systems strengthening, equitable access to pandemic response products (e.g., vaccines, therapeutics and diagnostics); and health equity and gender equality. The discussions highlighted the importance of embedding equity in the process; ensuring meaningful engagement from diverse voices; emphasizing transparency, accountability, and communication; promoting cooperation and collaboration; recognizing the importance of data; avoiding colonial approaches; and adopting a One Health approach.

This forum is just one element of Canada's partner and stakeholder engagement supporting the development of the pandemic instrument. Opportunities for partner and stakeholder engagement will continue, including via future meetings and written input. The information, views, and perspectives shared by partners and stakeholders will continue to inform Canada's involvement in the development of a pandemic instrument.

### REQUEST:

The Minister's Office received a request from MP Serre's Office, on behalf of a constituent, expressing their opposition to the signing of the Global Pandemic Treaty and any amendments to the International Health Regulations treaty with the World Health Organization.

### RESPONSE (CAN BE SHARED WITH THE MP'S OFFICE)

- Protecting the health and safety of all Canadians is a top priority of the Government of Canada.
- COVID-19 has demonstrated the need to take bold action to ensure we are better prepared for the next pandemic, which is why Canada is working closely with other countries and international partners, including the WHO, to strengthen pandemic prevention, preparedness, response and recovery. This includes actively participating in the development of a pandemic instrument.
  - The Government of Canada will work to ensure that Canadian priorities and values are reflected as we continue to engage in this process.
  - Member States will continue to lead the process to develop the instrument, which is expected to be presented at the 77th World Health Assembly in May 2024 for consideration and potential adoption.
- Canada is also a signatory to the IHR (2005), which is an important tool to keep Canadians healthy and safe through commitments and obligations that require countries to work together in a global health emergency.
  - At the 75<sup>th</sup> World Health Assembly in May 2022, Member States, including Canada, agreed by consensus on a forward process to consider possible amendments to the IHR (2005).
    - Member States themselves are leading the process and deciding on the content. As the starting point for this process, Member States were invited to submit amendment proposals.
    - The proposed amendments to the IHR that are currently being considered by Member States are still under negotiation.
    - While the outcomes of these efforts are not yet determined, Canada is ensuring that our sovereignty is maintained through any amendments to the IHR.

- When negotiating a new international instrument or amendments to existing instruments, the Government of Canada always carefully considers its potential impact on Canada's domestic laws and policies.
  - Evidence-informed decision-making and respect for national contexts are important principles for Canada.
  - Canada has full jurisdiction for any future domestic decisions about national restrictions or other measures related to health emergencies and pandemics.
  - The role of WHO has been and will continue to be advisory in nature, as WHO does not have jurisdiction in Canada.
  - WHO Member States will continue to lead the process of negotiating amendments to the IHR (2005) and the Pandemic Instrument, and the federal government will ensure that Canadian priorities and values are upheld.

## **Introduction**

The Canadian Cancer Survivor Network (CCSN) is a national organization of patients, families, survivors, friends, and community partners. Our mission is to work together by taking action to promote the very best standard of care, support, follow-up, and quality of life for cancer patients, survivors, and caregivers. With a steadfast commitment to supporting the interests and welfare of those affected by cancer, CCSN recognizes the immense challenges faced by these individuals throughout their journey. By prioritizing these key areas, we can collectively foster a supportive environment that addresses the unique needs of cancer survivors while empowering them to lead fulfilling lives beyond their diagnosis.

CCSN stands as a voice for the over 1.5 million Canadians living with cancer, a figure that has tragically and substantially increased in the past decade. The growing population of people affected by cancer face immense challenges, navigating a complex healthcare system while battling the physical and emotional toll of their diagnosis.

The impact of cancer extends far beyond the physical and emotional toll it exacts on individuals and their families. The financial hardships faced by those affected by cancer are often profound and can exacerbate the already challenging journey they must endure. From the moment of diagnosis, individuals find themselves navigating a complex web of medical services and expenses, including costly medications and supportive care services. Furthermore, many patients, survivors, and caregivers find themselves battling other indirect costs, including transportation expenses and parking charges at hospitals and cancer treatment centres. These financial burdens can quickly accumulate, placing immense strain on patients and their loved ones.

We commend the efforts of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Body (INB) in developing this important instrument for global health security. CCSN has established a set of recommendations for the Canadian representative on the INB regarding the development of a new WHO Pandemic Agreement. While the draft Agreement outlines robust measures for pandemic preparedness and response, CCSN identifies a gap regarding continuation of care for existing health conditions during crises. Patients with chronic illnesses, like cancer, face significant challenges in accessing essential healthcare services during crises. Disruptions in healthcare services during pandemics can have devastating consequences for individuals with chronic illnesses like cancer. Missed treatments, delayed surgeries, and limited access to medication can significantly worsen health outcomes and quality of life.





## **Protecting the Health of Patients During Crises**

The current draft of the WHO Pandemic Agreement, while comprehensive in its approach to infectious disease pandemics, lacks specific provisions to address the critical issue of continuation of care for existing health conditions, particularly chronic illnesses like cancer. During pandemics, disruptions in healthcare services due to overwhelmed systems, resource limitations, and safety measures can have devastating consequences for these patients. Missed treatments, delayed surgeries, and limited access to medication can significantly worsen health outcomes, increase mortality rates, and negatively impact quality of life.

From 2020 to 2023, the Canadian Cancer Survivor Network (CCSN) commissioned five surveys by Leger, a leading Canadian polling and market research firm. These surveys aimed to assess the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the lives of Canadians affected by cancer. The surveys targeted a broad range of individuals, including:

- **Cancer patients:** This group encompassed individuals currently undergoing cancer treatment, monitoring, or living with a past cancer diagnosis.
- **Caregivers:** This category included family members, friends, and loved ones who provide emotional and practical support to cancer patients.
- **Pre-diagnosis patients:** This group included individuals undergoing tests or experiencing symptoms suggestive of cancer but without a confirmed diagnosis yet.

The surveys revealed a concerning trend: **54% of respondents reported having appointments cancelled, postponed, or rescheduled** due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This disruption in access to essential cancer care services has the potential to significantly impact treatment outcomes and overall patient well-being.

### **Specific Challenges:**

- **Healthcare System Capacity:** Pandemics often overwhelm healthcare systems, leading to reduced access to essential services for chronic illnesses. Surgeries may be postponed, appointments cancelled, and access to specialists limited.
- **Supply Chain disruptions:** A crisis can disrupt global supply chains for essential medications, making it difficult for patients to access critical treatments.
- **Vulnerable Populations:** Patients with chronic illnesses are often more vulnerable to complications from infectious diseases. They may also face additional challenges due to compromised immune systems or the need for ongoing medical care.

### **Recommendations:**

To address these challenges, CCSN urges the INB to consider incorporating a dedicated article or section within the Agreement that explicitly outlines measures to ensure continuation of care for existing health conditions during crises and pandemics. This section should clearly define the importance of maintaining the capacity of healthcare systems to deliver essential services for



chronic illnesses. It should also address specific strategies for mitigating disruptions in care, such as:

- **Contingency and continuation plans:** This includes outlining clear protocols for ensuring essential services like surgeries, chemotherapy, and radiation therapy remain accessible during pandemics.
- **Diversifying supply chains:** The Agreement could encourage measures to diversify supply chains for essential medications to ensure continued access for chronic disease patients.
- **Prioritizing vulnerable populations:** The Agreement should highlight the need for clear guidelines to prioritize access to essential healthcare services for vulnerable populations during pandemics.

By incorporating a dedicated section on continuation of care, the Agreement would provide much-needed clarity and guidance for national governments in developing their pandemic preparedness plans. This will ensure that the needs of patients with chronic illnesses are explicitly considered and addressed, ultimately protecting their health and well-being during pandemics.

The COVID-19 pandemic exposed a critical gap in global pandemic preparedness: ensuring continuation of care for existing health conditions, particularly chronic illnesses like cancer. CCSN urges the INB to address this gap by incorporating the recommendations outlined above.

By prioritizing continuation of care within the WHO Pandemic Agreement, we can safeguard the health and well-being of millions of individuals living with chronic illnesses during pandemics. This will not only minimize the negative impact on their health outcomes and quality of life but also ensure a more robust and equitable global response to future health crises.

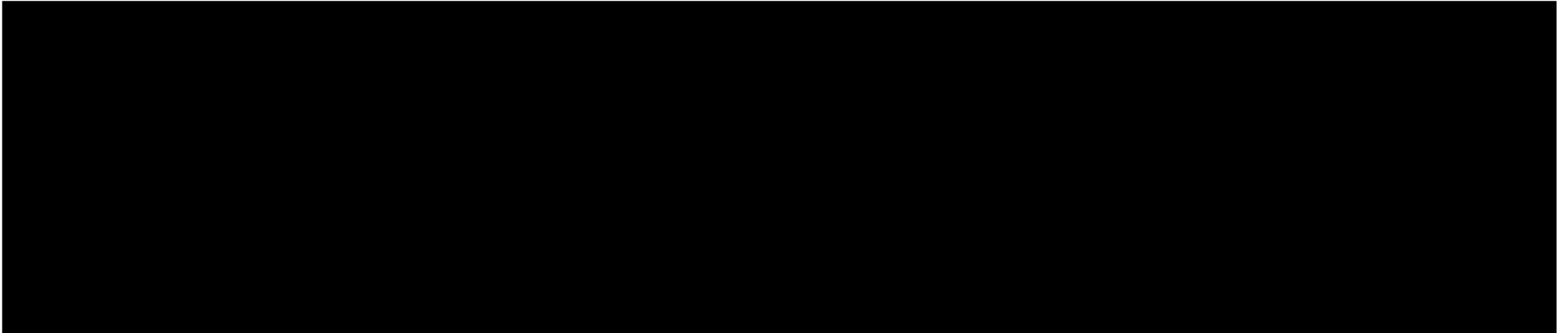

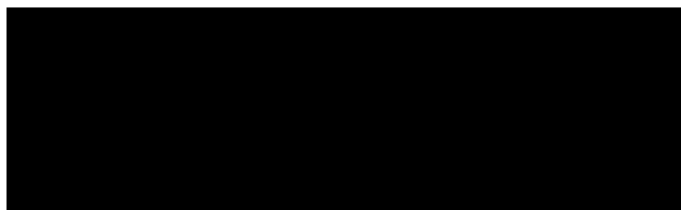

The most recent amendments to the WHO International Health Regulations and Pandemic Agreement are unacceptable. Canada must remain sovereign and not bound to obligations to an unelected, international body.

The response to the COVID-19 pandemic was a miserable failure. Prior to their worldwide implementation, no lockdown had ever been conducted in a laboratory environment. Not in a rat population. The mass testing was heavily problematic. RT-PCR tests have yet to be standardized. The WHO has not earned the trust of the Canadian people; indeed, it has shattered that trust. If the credibility of our institutions is to be restored, both domestic and international, the IHR and Pandemic Agreement must not be ratified under any circumstances. Go back to the drawing board, do nothing or, better yet, legislate restrictions against the ability of the WHO and other international organizations to encroach on our domestic legislative and law enforcement powers.

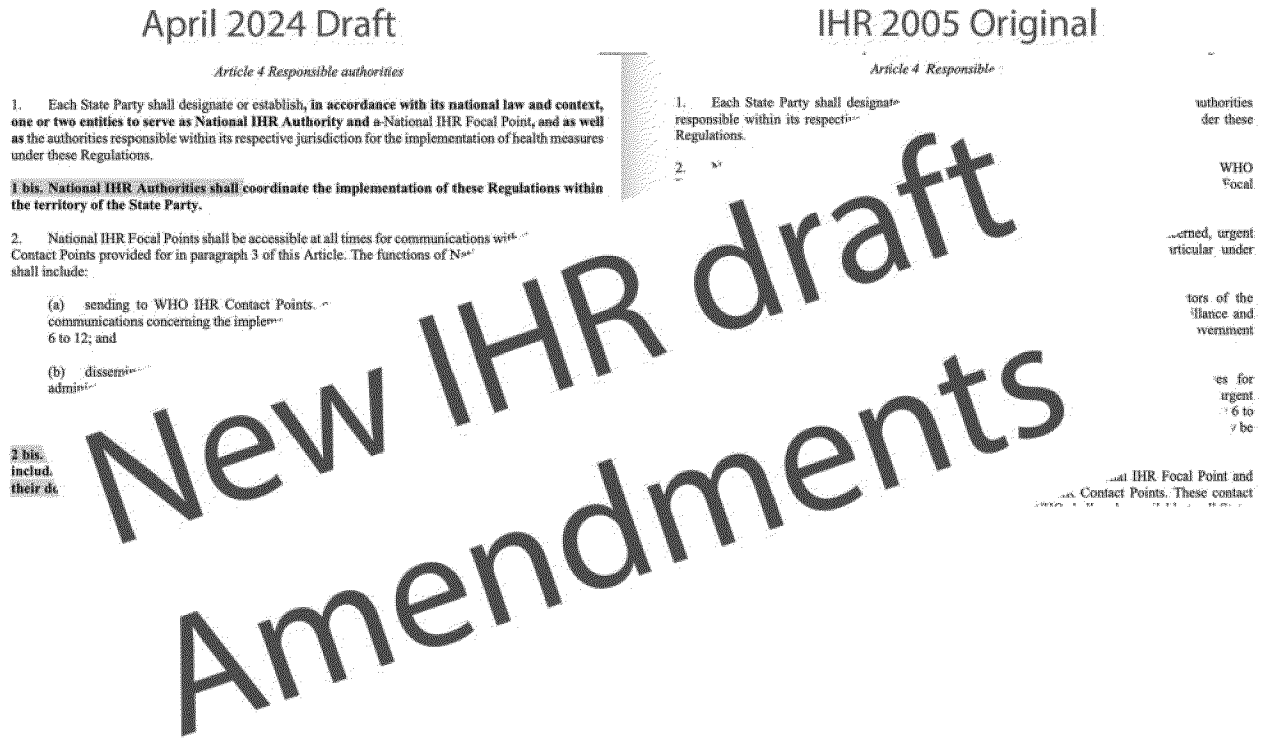

# Recently circulated: new draft of amendments to the IHR

**The 300+ amendments proposed last year have been whittled down to something readable, yet still problematic.**

The 8<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Working Group on the International Health Regulations (WGIHR) is happening this week. Their task has been to harmonize the 300+ proposed amendments to the International Health Regulations (IHR) 2005. These were first released in February 2023 to shock and dismay in the international community. They included items such as a strike through in “non-binding” and “with full respect for the dignity, human rights, and fundamental freedoms of persons.”

More than a year went by before an unofficial draft was leaked in February 2024.

Today, a working draft, dated April 17 2024, is being circulated. It appears to be a real working draft and is hosted on the WHO website.

**Primary Concerns & understanding how the document works:**

Rather than compare the April 17 2024 draft to prior draft amendments, let's compare it to the standing IHR 2005 – current international law. In the US, the IHR 2005 has been further reinforced into domestic legislation through the NDAAs 2023.

**Binding versus Non-binding:**

The IHR 2005, and this new draft, maintain the definition of recommendations being “non-binding.” However, a substantive change is the new definition of the National IHR Authority. This entity coordinates implementation of the IHR within the individual country.

Article 4 shows how this becomes binding (see the “shall” words? Go read the NDAAs 2023.)

- (ii) is exceeding, or is likely to exceed, the capacity of health systems to respond in those States Parties; and
- (iii) is causing, or is likely to cause, social and/or economic and/or political disruption in those States Parties; and
- (iv) requires rapid, equitable and enhanced coordinated international action, with whole-of-government and whole-of-society approaches.

"Organization" or "WHO" means the World Health Organization;

"permanent residence" has the meaning as determined in the national law of the State Party concerned;

"personal data" means any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person;

"point of entry" means a passage for international entry or exit of travellers, baggage, cargo, containers, conveyances, goods and postal parcels as well as agencies and areas providing services to them on entry or exit;

"port" means a seaport or a port on an inland body of water where ships on an international voyage arrive or depart;

"postal parcel" means an addressed article or package carried internationally by postal or courier services;

"public health emergency of international concern" means an extraordinary event which is determined, as provided in these Regulations:

- (i) to constitute a public health risk to other States through the international spread of disease and

Article 12 allows "pandemic emergencies" (i.e. potential pandemics) to be determined by the Director General.

*Article 12 Determination of a public health emergency of international concern, including a pandemic emergency*

1. Following the assessment referred to in paragraph 2, Part A of Annex 1, a State Party may report to WHO on the basis of a justified need and an implementation plan and, in so doing, obtain an extension of two years in which to fulfil the obligation in paragraph 1 of this Article. In exceptional circumstances and supported by a new implementation plan, the State Party may request a further extension not exceeding two years from the Director-General, who shall make the decision, taking into account the technical advice of the Review Committee. After the period mentioned in paragraph 1 of

## Censorship of misinformation; Surveillance

These items, problematic and illegal in some western countries, have been moved to Annex 1. Each state party "shall" develop these capacities both at the Intermediate and National Level.

3. States Parties and WHO shall support assessments, planning and implementation processes under this Annex.

4. Pursuant to Article 44, States Parties shall undertake, to the fullest extent possible and in support of WHO, to collaborate and assist each other in developing, strengthening and maintaining core capacities.

**A. CORE CAPACITIES REQUIREMENTS FOR PREVENTION, SURVEILLANCE, PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE**

52. At the intermediate public health response levels (hereinafter the "Intermediate level"), where applicable, each State Party shall develop, strengthen and maintain the core capacities:

- (a) to confirm the status of reported events and to support or implement additional control measures; and
- (b) to assess reported events immediately and, if found urgent, to report all essential information to the national level. For the purposes of this Annex, the criteria for urgent events include serious public health impact and/or unusual or unexpected nature with high potential for spread;
- (c) to coordinate with and support the local level in preparing for and responding to public health risks and other events, including in relation to:
  - (i) surveillance;
  - (ii) on-site investigations;
  - (iii) laboratory diagnostics, including referral of samples;
  - (iv) implementation of control measures;
  - (v) access to health services and health products;
  - (vi) risk communication, including countering misinformation and disinformation; and
  - (vii) logistics.

**A. CORE CAPACITY REQUIREMENTS FOR SURVEILLANCE AND RESPONSE**

1. States Parties shall utilize existing national structures and resources to meet their core capacity requirements under these Regulations, including with regard to:

**PART VI – HEALTH DOCUMENTS**

*Article 35 General rule*

1. No health documents, other than those provided for under these Regulations or in recommendations issued by WHO, shall be required in international traffic, provided however that this Article shall not apply to travellers seeking temporary or permanent residence, nor shall it apply to document requirements concerning the public health status of goods or cargo in international trade pursuant to applicable international agreements. The competent authority may request travellers to complete contact information forms and questionnaires on the health of travellers, provided that they meet the requirements set out in Article 23.

2. Health documents under these Regulations may be issued in non-digital format or digital format, subject to the obligations of any State Party regarding the format of such documents deriving from other international agreements.

3. Regardless of the format in which health documents under these Regulations have been issued, said health documents shall conform to the Annexes, referred to in Articles 36 to 39 as applicable, and their authenticity shall be ascertainable.

4. WHO, in consultation with States Parties, shall develop and update, as necessary, technical guidance, including specifications or standards related to the issuance and ascertainment of authenticity of health documents, both in digital format and non-digital format. Such specifications or standards shall be in accordance with Article 45 regarding treatment of personal data.

**PART VI – HEALTH DOCUMENTS**

*Article 35 General rule*

No health documents, other than those provided for under these Regulations or in recommendations issued by WHO, shall be required in international traffic, provided however that this Article shall not apply to travellers seeking temporary or permanent residence, nor shall it apply to document requirements concerning the public health status of goods or cargo in international trade pursuant to applicable international agreements. The competent authority may request travellers to complete contact information forms and questionnaires on the health of travellers, provided that they meet the requirements set out in Article 23.

*Article 36 Certificates of vaccination or other prophylaxis*

1. Vaccines and prophylaxis for travellers administered pursuant to these Regulations, or to recommendations and certificates relating thereto, shall conform to the provisions of Annex 6 and, when applicable, Annex 7 with regard to specific diseases.

2. A traveller in possession of a certificate of vaccination or other prophylaxis issued in conformity with Annex 6 and, when applicable, Annex 7, shall not be denied entry as a consequence of the disease to which the certificate refers, even if coming from an affected area, unless the competent authority has verifiable indications and/or evidence that the vaccination or other prophylaxis was not effective.

The same disease will have different factors at play due to local climates, economics, underlying health and regional genetics, and social realities. Imposed or even merely "suggested" solutions that work in one context may be disastrous in another. Imposing lock-downs in countries that have extremely well-connected social networks but poor digital networks, for example, will harm the populace far more than in countries that are more characterized by individualism and ubiquitous digital technology for example. (Though we saw during Covid that even in digital societies, isolation harms many.) Poor neighbourhoods also do far worse than richer ones. Those in colder climates often have extreme seasonal variation while sunnier and hotter locations are less impacted overall.

Assuming a single disease can be treated in a singular way is folly that ignores the fact we are not simply sacs of water, bacteria, and biological processes in a lab. It ignores that health and immunity are often far more affected by the undulating interactions of all facets of life and not simply chemical interactions. Exercise, sunshine, social connection, access to wealth, optimism; all improve health. Insurance analysts know to halve a person's life expectancy when the file documents the client is isolated. That means it is a far far greater threat to most people than viral or bacterial disease. As the dust settles from Covid, we have learned the hard way the reality of this.

But during Covid, most institutions, including the WHO, ignored the health risks of isolation. Ideologues within the WHO and government agencies manipulated centralized systems to ensure these simple, already-well-documented realities were ignored.

The fact this treaty comes down to a single organization and one with a singular focus is so incredibly shortsighted it beggars belief how anyone who lived through Covid can still propose such insanity. It ignores all we learned during Covid: that centralization increases the chances of barreling down the wrong path. It obliterates layers of checks and balances, allowing fewer people to make calls with less and less oversight, increasing the odds of those bad calls being entrenched and imposed upon the world at large. It leads to gatekeepers and censorship; not to the benefit of anyone but the powerful, hoping to silence their competition.

The reality is there cannot be proper debate and dialogue within a single, non-elected institution. There needs to be competition and debate in the open so that only the best ideas and strategies survive.

It is even better if these discussions are done at the local level, which has a far better track record at solving the problems within it.

And the final say MUST come down to those who can and WILL be held accountable for their choices.

If anything, the Covid pandemic proved that it is not that we should be widening the powers or influence of single entities like the WHO but fracturing them. Most countries already followed the same path during Covid (lock-downs, isolation, masks, shots) yet we saw no improvement to outcomes from that lock-step effort. And we saw no detriment from or to the alternative efforts of those who did not comply. It was often the localities that bucked the "accepted" recommendations that fared better despite being surrounded by regions that conformed. I.E. Even with most people exacerbating the problem, the contrarians STILL benefited from their unique and localized approaches. Does that alone not show that a uniform, strict adherence to policy is not required for beneficial outcomes?

Simply because there is a global problem does not mean it requires a global solution. Any system that requires puritanical adherence to it to work will ALWAYS fail when applied in the real world. Hypotheticals and computer models are worthless in the infinitely more complex environment of reality. Trial and error has a far higher success rate than models or theories and the WHO has proven with Covid they have become - at best - amateur, armchair academics.

The WHO Pandemic Treaty will not be worth the paper it is printed on in the real world. And its contribution to the march towards centralization and censorship creates too high a price for this treaty to be pursued.

On the whole, humanity has always and will always be able to find ways through natural viral pandemics, but we likely will never survive a pandemic of political and ideological hubris of this magnitude.
